

#### **The Power of Encouragement**

Barnabas, one of my favourite saints, is remembered this month on 11th June. He's one of my favourites because above everything else he was known for being an encourager. Barnabas wasn't his original name; he was Joseph. However, the other apostles of the time nicknamed him "Son of

Encouragement" i.e. Barnabas.

We read about Barnabas in the New Testament book of Acts, which tells the story of the beginnings of the Church. Among other things, Barnabas was known for his generosity. He sold a field he owned and offered the money he received to help those in need.

When others were wary about Paul, following his conversion from being a Christian-hating persecutor to committed Jesus follower, it was Barnabas that stood up for him and encouraged his ministry. When Paul and Barnabas later had a difference of opinion about the dependability of Mark, it was Barnabas that gave him a second chance, trusted him and later Paul also came to recognise Mark's value. Barnabas was a great support and encouragement to the new church in Antioch where he spent much time as a leader.

If only we had more people like Barnabas! In our fast-paced and often pressured world, encouragement can sometimes feel in short supply. We hear a lot of critique, we face constant comparisons, and it's all too easy to focus on what's going wrong. Our political system is built on being adversarial, and social media is full of people trying to knock others down. Encouragement is a much needed quality, I think.

Barnabas was the kind of person who stood by others when they were struggling or had made mistakes. He didn't give up on people. And because of that, those he encouraged went on to do great things.

Encouragement is more than just being nice — it's about lifting others up when life has dragged them down. It's about seeing potential where others might see problems. It's about choosing to be kind in a world that often rewards being clever or critical. It allows for second chances.

We all need encouragement in our lives; it builds people up and helps them to be the best version of themselves. Imagine what our communities would look like if we all made it a habit to encourage one another. A word of support to a colleague, a message of appreciation to a friend, taking time to notice someone's quiet efforts—these things cost little but mean a great deal.





#### Month on the Farm



The house martins and swallows have well and truly arrived and when I was checking and moving some cattle in the meadow the cattle and I were surrounded by them swooping around feeding on the flies. They are now back here in the yard as well, busy rebuilding their nests. We always make sure there are a couple of damp muddy areas around to help them for this year's sitting.

Most of the farmyard manure has been spread and incorporated into the soil as part of the fertilizer for the maize. With the wet winter and the cattle grazing the turnips and cover crops the soil was compacted so on these fields we pulled the sub soiler through the ground to lift the soil and remove the tight patches which allows the soil to breathe and the plant roots to go down deeper, hopefully finding water and nutrients. After the soil was lifted we then went

through with the heavy cultivator which mixes the soil, muck and crop residue together and breaks the lumpy soil down. We then went through the field with a combination of discs and a roller to get a finer seedbed before the maize was drilled using a precision drill, which places one seed at a time in rows 30 centimetres apart. We then followed behind with the ring roller to try to conserve any moisture there is. The lack of rain and the cold nights has certainly slowed down the grass growth with many of the fields slow to recover after the first round of grazing and the fields that are shut up for silage or hay a long way off having any quantity of growth for cutting.



The lambs are growing well and enjoying the grass and have started to eat some rolled barley and nuts, helping them to grow faster and be less reliant on their mother's milk. We feed this in a covered trough which has adjustable holes which is opened wide enough for the lambs' heads to get through but not far enough for the ewes' head. With the warmer days the ewes fleeces are starting to lift as the grease rises and the shearing gang are booked for a couple of weeks' time. Another group of weaned calves have today been turned out to grass and will rotate around the grazing paddocks grazing the grass and also having a couple of kilos of rolled barley every day to keep them growing.





The proposed development site is situated in uncomfortably close proximity to an existing slurry lagoon. This raises serious concerns regarding odour and air quality: The location may expose future occupants to unpleasant and persistent odours, particularly during warmer months or times of slurry agitation and spreading.

2. Overdevelopment of the Site

The Parish Council considers the proposal to represent overdevelopment of what is essentially an agricultural site. The scale and intensity of the proposed residential use appear disproportionate to the rural character and infrastructure of the area.

# Disinheritance by Deception





If you think "fraudulent calumny" sounds like something from a Shakespeare play, you are not far wrong. The concept of pouring poison in the ear was a common theme for the playwright. Sadly, however, it is still very much relevant today in the context of Wills.

Lucy Mignot, Partner and Head of Contentious Trusts and Probate at Blanchards Bailey, explains this issue in detail.

Fraudulent calumny occurs when a person poisons a will-maker's mind against someone who would otherwise be their natural beneficiary, and as a result the will-maker disinherits the person they have been poisoned against or leaves them less than they would be expected to receive. If fraudulent calumny is proved, the entire Will may be rendered invalid and set aside, reverting to the Will-maker's previous will or, if they did not have one, the intestacy rules. In practice, these disputes are often between siblings, where one is alleged to have spread lies about the other to a parent. There are cases where it was alleged that a parent had been deceived into believing that one of their children had stolen from them. was a shopaholic and spendthrift, or was untrustworthy.

Fraudulent calumny will only be established if the person casting the aspersions knew that what they were telling the Will-maker was untrue or they did not care whether or not it was true, and there is no other explanation for the disinheritance. It is a subtle form of undue influence where, rather than being forced into making changes against their Will, the Will-maker makes the changes of their own volition because their perception of the person they are disinheriting has been skewed. Fraudulent calumny is often missed by inexperienced or non-specialist

### **Notes from St Andrew's**



In the evening, we raised our Alleluias at Compline, which has been very well supported throughout Lent this year. The Easter Garden has been much admired, and we thank those who helped create it, especially the three young people involved. As a result of a generous benefactor paying for the lower parts of the nave walls to be repainted (using approved Clay-based paint), the Easter Garden has been taken down earlier than usual. We thank the benefactor for this work; it has made the Church look so much cleaner and brighter.

It was good to welcome friends from Puddletown to two of our Services recently. It was lovely to have you with us; do come again!

On May 4<sup>th</sup>, Tony led a Service of Thanksgiving and Dedication to commemorate the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of VE Day. Words from Psalm 46 were sung with great gusto to the tune of the Dam Busters March, amongst other hymns. On VE Day itself, there were commemorations at the Memorial Stone and the Union Flag flew proudly from the church tower. In the evening, the bells were rung. We thank Robin and his team for organising that. As far as I can gather, a peal wasn't possible in 1945 as, when the bells were augmented and rehung in 1967, the "Echo" report stated that the bells had been silent for 30+ years. As the bells were pealing, news reached us that Cardinal Robert Prevost had been elected Pope Leo XIV. We pray for him and rejoice with our Roman Catholic brothers and sisters as a new chapter opens in the life of the Church.

## Why weights and measures matter

Celebrated in May each year, World Metrology Day helps the public to understand what is meant by the science of measurement and why we are all so dependent upon it.

Day to day most people wouldn't give weights and measures any thought, so it's good to be reminded how important it is to have fair rules for buying, selling, and measuring things. Trading Standards are one of the key parts of this system, and they play an important role in making sure life runs smoothly and fairly.

Weights and Measures law is about making sure consumers don't get a short measure. Trading Standards check local trader scales to make sure they are accurate, if for example weighing fruit, meat or vegetables. Checks are made too on measuring equipment so if you're sold a metre of for example cloth, or rope then that too is correct. Optics that measure spirits, or measures that hold a pint, or litre, are also checked for accuracy.

Beyond the high street, Trading Standards are vital in other areas too. They make sure fuel stations give the right amount of petrol, that weighbridges used to weigh heavy goods vehicles are accurate to help keep roads safe, or that manufacturers packing goods by weight on vast production lines keep within the rules. Without these rules and the checks, things could get unfair quickly.

Much of the work of Trading Standards is behind the scenes to protect us, making sure we live in a fair world where buying and selling is based on trust and accuracy. So, next time you shop, remember how these rules quietly keep life fair and simple!
