Oh no it's not . . .

We all know those traditional pantomime responses that assist audiences to be involved in the performance before them as it unfolds on the stage: "He's behind you", "Boo", "Hiss", "Oh no he's not"; "Oh yes she is".

Our media and politicians have been encouraging their own to-and-fro call and response phrases this year. Headlines in our papers and on social media, as far back as August, were proclaiming "Christmas is cancelled", while the politicians retorted that that

could never happen. In the words of the Transport Secretary Grant Shapps to *Times Radio* on 15th October: "Christmas will go ahead. We'll be able to see our friends and families. There will be food, there will be gifts."

It's a strange old world. In 2020 we were being told Christmas would be cancelled because we wouldn't be able to spend it with loved ones as usual; this year we're being told Christmas is at risk of cancellation because essentials like turkey, Barbie dolls/accessories and Paw Patrol might be unavailable.

It makes me want to ask – what is Christmas all about? What are the essentials and what are the add-ons? Why is it so important to share with family and friends, to eat traditional food and to replenish one's stock of gadgets, toys and novelty slippers?

Love is the answer. We want to be with family because we love them. We buy or make gifts to bring happiness to our loved ones. We eat together because that is one of the best ways known to humankind to celebrate and share life's good things. We long for Christmas to be a joy-filled experience.

The love that means most, however, is that of being together – that is why it was so hard last year when people couldn't gather as usual because of the covid restrictions.

Christmas can be hard for those who live alone. I remember my final year as an assistant curate some twenty years ago; weeping alone in an empty church building on Christmas morning after services were over and everyone else had gone home to family, friends and Christmas dinners is a poignant memory. What awaited me was an empty house.

I was wrong – my house wasn't empty, for I had forgotten the heart of that Christmas message I'd been preaching that morning, that we are never truly alone, for God is with us. That Christ-child in the manger in church had come home with me in my heart.

A Month on the Farm

Early November and the first frosts of winter came about at the same time as the first group of cattle were housed in one of the barns on a straw bed with a diet of round bale silage, straw, rolled barley with some rape meal and minerals added until turnout next spring. Others are still out on either mustard or turnips where they will remain until the fields have finished being grazed over the winter months. One group is still on a large stretch of water meadows but with the recent rains and grass growth slowing down they are shortly to come off and graze some drier fields of grass.

Recently, though we experienced one of the local problems of our water meadows where some cattle inadvertently managed to find some deadly water hemlock roots from the river's edges: this is seriously deadly and within an hour or so killed five animals: - a couple of others seemed not well for a few days but recovered. A very quick removal from the field of all the remaining cattle was undertaken, and a post mortem was done rapidly by the vet to confirm our worst fears.

Winter corn sowing has continued on all our fields around the home farm, Cheselbourne, Tincleton and outlying farms, where we are contracted in to help do some of the work. The mustard cover crops which have been grazed off by the cattle were direct drilled straight into the mustard stubble using a 'no tillage' method: this prevents less soil disturbance and carbon release. Some of the fields that were not grazed had a tall crop of green cover to drill through which caused some problems with the drill blocking up with plant material, so we had to borrow another drill, worth in excess of a staggering eighty thousand pounds! Other fields have been spread with a good coating of well



rotted farmyard manure, a good source of fertilizer – nitrogen, phosphate, potash and other goodies.



Work on a new barn for storage of straw and hay as well as some machinery is coming along well, with everyone busy. The roof has just been completed, though we saw a delay in the delivery of roofing sheets as well as inputs such as fertilizers and sprays, most of which have gone up in price, if they can even be sourced

Milborne St. Andrew Gardening Club ... Steeptonbill Farm Shop

Now and again, if you're lucky, you'll find yourself listening to a speaker who is truly inspirational. On 28th October, members were able to listen to Steve Gould from Steeptonbill Farm Shop in Milton Abbas. Steve gave his thoughts on growing vegetables and a background to the creation and



growth of his business. It's rare to find someone who has spent his working life helping and serving people by growing vegetables and educating others to grow vegetables. His enthusiasm for his work remains undiminished. Some interesting facts:

Supermarkets require vegetable suppliers to grow varieties that have a long shelf life. These varieties will often be chemically treated, low in natural sugars and low in taste. Home growers are able to select varieties that are high in natural sugars and have a great taste. Steeptonbill Farm grown vegetables are not sprayed with chemicals and are grown for their taste, which is why Steve supplies many restaurants as well as the public.

During lockdown, when panic buyers were causing extreme shortages of many essential items, Steve was able to secure supplies and help many local people. At one point he was helping six hundred people every day!

This business is a local gem, providing great tasting vegetables, homegrown meats, other supplies and employment for local people (six at the time of our talk). We're lucky to have it and it deserves our support.

PS. Steve didn't pay me to write this ... I'm just really impressed with his business!

In November, members met at the Milborne Village Hall for a social event and AGM. The gardening club takes a break in December but will meet again at the village hall on Thursday 20th January 2022, starting 7.30pm, when we'll be learning about garden design.

Needless to say, we'll be following government COVID guidelines to ensure our use of the village hall is as safe as possible.


