THE VICAR'S LETTER

Whose world is it anyway?



Martin Luther, the 16th-century Reformer, is alleged to have said: "If I knew the world would end tomorrow, I would still plant my apple tree."

There are different ways of interpreting this, but one possibility is to suggest that whatever the future holds, we should continue to do what we know is right.

By the time you read this, the General Election will seem a while ago, but as I write these thoughts it is still to come. Manifesto pledges often never make it into reality, but it is interesting to see what each political Party is offering in terms of planting trees. Of the main Parties, the highest promise would mean planting 170 trees per minute every minute until the end of 2040 (Labour); the lowest commitment 57 trees every minute until the end of 2024 (Conservative). Planting trees is a good thing for our creation, and deforestation over the years is one contributor to the climate change we are currently experiencing. However, on average one tree takes 100 years to absorb one tonne of carbon; a human being's activities give out ten tonnes a year. It's going to take an awful lot of trees to counteract that.

Most people believe that climate change is now a serious threat to the wellbeing of our world. Many say they want to do something about it. Extinction Rebellion has raised consciousness of climate-change activism. But protests and marches only go so far. Unless we all act in a way to preserve the wonders and beauties of God's creation, the damage will increase.

We say we want a better world, but how many of us are truly willing to make the sacrifices that will entail? How many people are willing to forego our foreign holidays? How many of us will walk a bit further in the rain when we can get into our cars and drive? How many of us count the airmiles in our food and endeavour to buy more local produce? How many of us enjoy buying new clothes when we have plenty of older ones that we can still wear? The biggest rise in the type of cars people are currently buying at present is in the gas-guzzling SUV category.

Most people are concerned about our world and its future, but for many that concern stops at the point it will mean a real change to our way of life. On the whole we have become very comfortable with our environmentally damaging lifestyles.

Christians and those of other faiths believe that God's hand is in Creation, and that we humans have a responsibility to care for our world and its amazing variety of life. Often it is those of no faith who speak loudest and act most gently towards our planet.





QUICK AND EASY RECIPES FROM AROUND THE BENEFICE

This recipe is truly quick and easy and very, very tasty! This recipe will serve four people but it is simple to halve the ingredients to serve two. The sausages are delicious cold with some chutney and a hunk of bread. I have used the recipe with thinner cocktail sausages and simply reduced the cooking time to 20 - 25 minutes.

BAKED MUSTARD and LEMON SAUSAGES

Ingredients:

- 8 plump pork sausages
- 2 tablespoons of grainy mustard
- A tablespoon of smooth Dijon mustard
- 3 heaped tablespoons of runny honey
- 2 tablespoons of freshly squeezed lemon juice

Method:

Pre-heat the oven to 200C/Fan 180C/350F/Gas 4.

Put the sausages in a roasting tin which is large enough to take them in a single layer. If they overlap, they will not cook properly.

In a bowl mix the mustards, honey and lemon juice together. Stir really well until mixture is combined. Pour the mixture over the sausages.

Bake for 25-30 minutes, rolling the sausages over in the honey and mustard mixture twice during the cooking period so that they eventually take on a sticky glossy coat.

Check that the sausages are thoroughly cooked through, then remove from the oven and enjoy.



There was a lovely birthday cake which the children, together with the Bishop and Chief Executive, helped cut in honour of Gill Ford's special birthday. We all shared a beautifully presented afternoon tea with lots of delicious eats. An afternoon to remember.

Statistically last year the thirty three cathedrals across Britain raised £1.33 million with Christingle Services and within the Salisbury diocese there were 124 services raising £30,282. Nationally £1.7 million was raised from House Boxes.



Remember the Millennium Bug?

Just over 20 years ago, there was widespread panic – or at least deep concern – over what might happen when the calendar switched over to the year 2000 on 1st January, and the effect on computers of the so-called Y2K ‘Millennium Bug’.

The problem was that computers so long ago were laughably short of memory, and to save space, years in dates had all been recklessly programmed with two figures – for example 80, instead of the full 1980. So, when they reached 2000, no-one knew what would happen. Would the computers think they were back at 00, the beginning of time, or in some other dimension where time had no meaning?

Possible consequences ranged from the Second Coming to explosions in nuclear plants and aircraft falling out of the sky. Many experts predicted disaster of one kind or another. Churches were not immune. But in the end more or less nothing happened. Some put this down to the preventative work done by computer technicians – at a price – while others thought it was never going to happen anyway.

The cost of countering the Y2K Bug threat cost Britain nearly £400 million. There were problems, but nothing huge – except the sigh of relief.







Last year National Geographic reported that the excess light "we dump into our environments is endangering ecosystems by harming animals whose life cycles depend on dark." The magazine went on to warn: "We're endangering ourselves by altering the biochemical rhythms that normally ebb and flow with natural light levels."

In times gone by...

In the first of an occasional series we look at the wellspring of the close-knit community of Dewlish...

ALL SAINTS' CHURCH

Celtic origins of Dewlish meant “Dark Stream” or “Devil’s Brook”, but its name changed very differently over many decades until settling to Devenis by the time of the Domesday Book. By 1100AD it was known as Divelis, a church there being confirmed by a charter of Henry I and later when Henry VIII gave the Rectory, together with that of Mylborne, to Michel Lyster.

Not all of the church existed in the 12th century but it has been ascertained that the north and west doorways and the nave are of Norman origin. The tower, built in the 14th century, contains three bells – a treble 1724, second 1663 and tenor inscribed “IW 1620 In God Rejoice”.

The roof of the 15th century chancel is concealed by a segmental plaster ceiling. When this was removed in the nave over 20 years ago an arch-braced collar-beam in five bays was discovered, it possibly being of 15th and 16th centuries’ origin. The north aisle also dates to the 16th century, while the south arcade was possibly added when All Saints’ was considerably restored in 1872. The north porch and main door are 18th century, the vestry 19th century, and the font is 13th century.

Other pieces of the dating jigsaw are: examples of Jacobean woodwork in the pulpit and choirstalls (the cup and cover are said to be by Stratford, dated 1574), the paten 1638 and the brass German alms-dish is 16th century. While the communion rails are mainly late 17th century, the communion table is comparatively modern.

The church walls are of knapped flint with bands of stone, while the tower is of coursed rubble. The nave is roofed with Westmoreland or Cornish slates, and other parts have stone-slabbed roofs.

Inside All Saints’ interested visitors will find a wide range of monuments and windows dedicated to people who have lived in the village down the years, in particular a number commemorating the Michel family and their descendants who lived at Dewlish House.



Salisbury Cathedral's Sponsor a Stone project

A ceremony has taken place to mark the completion of a number of Salisbury Cathedral's *Sponsor a Stone* projects.

About 30 sponsors and supporters attended the topping out of St Peter's Gable on the scaffolding surrounding the north-east corner of the cathedral.

The Dean blessed one of the stones, which was then placed in position by head mason Lee Andrews.

Dean Nicholas said this was "another milestone in the achievement of the Major Repair Programme (MRP) of the cathedral".

He paid tribute to and thanked clerk of the works Gary Price, Lee and the team of masons, whom he called "extraordinarily skilled craftsmen and women".

"We are exceedingly blessed that they work here day by day and care for this remarkable building," he said.

The stone at the east end needed more work than was envisaged: instead of the estimated 500-600 stones needing repair or replacement, there were 1,023.

Confluence – the 2020 flower festival at Salisbury Cathedral

Planning for the flower festival, one of next year's events to mark the 800th anniversary of the laying of Salisbury Cathedral's foundation stone is well underway.

Entitled Confluence, it will take place from 15th to 20th September.

The launch of the festival was attended by more than 300 flower arrangers from across the diocese who will take part in creating the displays.

Michael Bowyer, director of flowers at Salisbury Cathedral and one of the festival's designers, said: "The 2020 theme is movement and our designs will focus specifically on the fact that the cathedral sits at the confluence of five rivers, which summons up wonderful images of flowing shapes and gorgeous light and colour."

Ashford wholesaler Southeast Flowers will be supplying more than 30,000 stems for the displays and the arrangers will take part in a series of workshops in the run-up to the festival.

The festival is part of a year-long programme of celebrations: there will be a light and sound show early in the year, an art exhibition featuring 20 works by artists such as Henry Moore and Grayson Perry, and a heritage trail.
