Batty about Bells

And then there were the bells. Six of them. I knew a couple of people who had been bell ringers for years. They were short of numbers. Did I want to have a go? I looked at the ringers, the ropes going high up into the ceiling and wondered about my physical ability. Would they be too heavy for me? Would I make a fool of myself? Was I expected to take the bell all on my own straight away?

"It's all right. We will start you off with some qualified Association of Ringing Teachers people, give you an easy bell to begin with and promise not to leave you all by yourself at the end of a rope! If you don't like it then just say. It is a bit like marmite you will either think, ugh not for me! or become absolutely addicted."

I wasn't sure, but somewhat reluctantly went along to the practice session that had been arranged for a 1:1 lesson. I climbed the cobwebby spiral stone steps up to the ringing chamber, where ropes with red, white and blue 'sallies' disappeared up through holes in the ceiling. Robin and Richard were

there to greet me and ready to explain how it all worked. They even took me up another flight of spiral stone steps to see a bell 'turned over' which meant actually ringing in a full three hundred and sixty degree circle. Once we returned to the ringing chamber the lesson began.

"The treble is the lightest bell and strikes the highest note and the tenor is the deepest-toned and heaviest at around fifteen hundredweight – three quarters of a ton. We will start you on this one first as it is not too heavy. First we need to explain some safety points and check if was shown how to stand a hand stretch away from the sally and then asked to pull it to chime the bell. As the rope tugged at my arms, Robin, who was teaching me, guided me through gradual- "You are still pulling a bit too hard Mr Dunn!" ly going down the rope until the pulling



seemed less heavy as the bell gradually rose and it was propelled around by its own weight. I was told to keep hold of the end and not to let go. I had heard how much bell ringing enables one to exercise and this was certainly stretching my arms and back muscles. After a while Robin asked me to 'nibble' bits of the rope back in and the bell gradually rang faster and faster as the size of its rotational circle reduced.

"After two to three more sessions like this you will be able to join the team," Richard told me confidently. I was given a little blue book and Robin ticked off tour of the bells, different parts of the bell explained, role of stay explained, explanation of bell up and down, ring a bell part up from down with assistance and arranged to meet a couple of days later for lesson number two. "When we have ticked a few more boxes you can be assessed for your Level One Certificate and badge," they said as we climbed down the spiral staircase and back to the world outside. I couldn't wait.

Month on the Farm

As the year rolls on, the weather has turned a little more seasonal with some cold days and nights. This has been very welcome and allows us to blow lots of cold air through the barley and wheat that is still in store. It needs to be cooled right down to stop the grain mites from breeding and keep it smelling sweet.

More loads of wheat have been moving off the farm and we are rolling tons of barley (putting it between two metal rollers to break the grain) and mixing this with minerals and rape meal to feed to the cattle.

The first field of mustard and turnips has now been grazed and will soon be drilled into winter wheat, after the field has had a light coating of well rotted farmyard manure. With the later drilling of the seed we plant more seeds to the square metre to allow for losses due to weather and pest damage. The early sown crops have grown on well and some are now in need of some frost or cold wind to slow the growth and keep pests and diseases under control.





One group of cattle are still out grazing grass at Cheselbourne, with them being fed the barley mix to supplement the lack of quality now in the grass. Two more groups are eating their way through the mustard and turnips mixture, with the fence being moved daily to give them a fresh bite, and they are also fed some silage bales made back in the early summer and some straw.

All the other cattle are now housed and are fed on the barley mixture, hay, straw and or silage and are bedded on straw.







<u>Update from Dorchester & Sherborne offices of Central Dorset Citizens Advice</u>

As an older person could Pension Credit boost your pension income?

In these difficult financial times the Government is concerned that around 2 million older people could boost their income by claiming Pension Credit (PC) but have not done so! Perhaps you know an older family relative or friend who could be eligible?

For those who have reached State Pension age, PC tops up your weekly income to £182.60 if you are single, and £278.70 if you have a partner, There are some circumstances where PC can still be paid if your income is higher, or you have some savings.

Eligibility for PC can be complicated; some key points are:

- no National Insurance payments record is required
- you can still be working and claim PC if your income is not high
- any savings over £10,000 will affect the amount of PC paid
- If you receive other benefits such as PIP, Disability Living Allowance or Attendance Allowance the weekly Guarantee Credit amount can pay more than the minimum income threshold of £182.60
- PC can be backdated 3 months provided entitlement conditions were met throughout that time
- PC is also important as it is a passport to other benefits, including free TV licence

The naming of Jesus

Matthew and Luke tell how the angel instructed that Mary's baby was to be named Jesus - a common name meaning 'saviour'. The Church recalls the naming of Jesus on 1st January - eight days after 25th December (by the Jewish way of reckoning days). In Jewish tradition, the male babies were circumcised and named on their eighth day of life.

For early Christians, the *name* of Jesus held a special significance. In Jewish tradition, names expressed aspects of personality. Jesus' name permeated His ministry, and it does so today: we are baptised in the name of Jesus (Acts 2:38), we are justified through the name of Jesus (1 Cor 6:11); and God the Father has given Jesus a name above all others (Phil 2:9). All Christian prayer is through 'Jesus Christ our Lord', and it is 'at the name of Jesus' that one day every knee shall bow.



Pete and the education team ran a Youth Eco Day, to which a group of 20 12-16 -year-olds came along to create a bug cathedral and explore the cathedral via a tower tour.

"The young people from Salisbury and the surrounding area had the opportunity to create an amazing environment for insects in an enormous bug cathedral, which was built by the cathedral's carpenter, Richard Pike," he said.

Since then, the cathedral has run an evening bat walk and set up a weekly eco club.





The Coming of the Magi

Where is the One who has been born King of the Jews? We saw His star in the east and have come to worship Him.' So Matthew tells of the coming of the Magi, or Wise Men, to the baby Jesus. Today we remember it on Epiphany, on 6th January. Did they come from Arabia Felix – nowadays southern Arabia? How many came? No one knows, but by the 6th century they were named Gaspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. Why gold, frankincense and myrrh? Gold stands for kingship: Jesus was King of the Jews. Frankincense stands for divinity; Jesus was to be worshipped. Myrrh stands for death and burial; Jesus would become a sacrifice and die for His people. The Wise Men were the very first gentiles ever to worship Jesus. Isaiah foresaw this response to Jesus: 'Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn.' The Magi wanted to worship Jesus; Herod wanted to kill Him. But the Jewish leaders who knew about the prophecy of a Messiah born in Bethlehem did not even bother to visit to Bethlehem. And it is only six miles from Jerusalem!
