Whatever stage of life we find ourselves in – celebrating, grieving, or just getting on with the everyday – God is with us. And our village churches are here for you too, as places and communities where we can bring both joys and sorrows, and remind ourselves that none of us is ever truly alone.





#### Month on the Farm

As I write this in the middle of August the harvest for us has all finished, one of the earliest we have done. Nearly all the grain came in under the required moisture content for selling on with only air being blown through the grain heaps to cool them. If the grain stays warm you can get the grain mites breeding and end up with a problem so the quicker you can cool the grain the better, not always easy with hot days and nights! Generally the yields have been good and certainly a lot better than we were anticipating other than a couple of fields, one on the gravel and one with heavier soil being a little lower yielding. The straw was not as plentiful but it is a nice



and bright yellow colour having had next to no rain over the field ripening period.



Some of the winter fodder mix of rape, turnips and radish have been drilled with some already germinating and showing through the ground, but now in desperate need of rain before the tiny plants wither up and die. We are becoming very reliant on the fodder crops growing and producing lots of winter feed for the winter as silage and hay stocks are very depleted with the lack of grass growth over the summer. Some fields that we should have cut twice or even three times have not grown back sufficiently to warrant cutting again and have just had to be grazed. Most groups of cattle are now being fed some rolled barley mix as the grass is now

just dead and brown stalks, here and the fields north of Puddletown as well out just east of Dorchester, though some of the water meadows are just holding up moving them round and round the different fields including those near Dorchester's Greys Bridge.

Over the last month we have been feeding the lambs a nut and barley mix to help them grow on as the hot weather had stopped them putting condition on and they needed a boost to get them away, which has worked well and another load went to Salisbury Market this week.

Some of the fields are to have a six metre grass margin drilled around them and an area of wild flowers as part of our sustainable farming incentive scheme to encourage the wildlife, bees and bugs to thrive and do their thing!

We have brought some cattle back into the sheds and are feeding them ad lib barley and straw to get them heavier so we can sell them away. We are fortunate in a way that we grow the barley, which is now even cheaper, so we can mill that and feed it to the cattle and sheep, so in effect adding value to the livestock and grain. Some of the wheat has just been sold and is to be moved shortly to feed some pigs, and next week we will be cleaning some of this year's just harvested barley and wheat to drill in October to cut next summer. At least with the early harvest we can go to the local Agricultural Shows without the feeling we should be at home harvesting!







#### PUDDLETOWN AREA PARISH COUNCIL

As summer winds down, here's your update from the Parish Council, covering everything from local safety improvements and neighbourhood planning to bus shelters, playparks, and planning decisions. Here are the key highlights from our August meeting.

Youth Council Progress: Following the Youth Council's report on the Coombe Road footpath, Dorset Council Highways has referred the matter to the Road Safety Team, who have been chased for feedback. Dorset Waste Partnership is considering moving a bin to improve access but warns of a two-year backlog. They've also advised that the Parish Council cannot relocate the bin themselves due to underground utility risks. The Council will continue pressing for action.

**Keeping Our Spaces Safe and Enjoyable:** Playparks: Butt Close and Orchard Meadow had no new issues this month. At Puddletown Rec, the away dugout is leaning, and as a result PRIDE has been asked to repair it.

**Defibrillators**: Both Parish Council units are in working order. The British Heart Foundation has reopened its 2025 defibrillator grant scheme, and the Clerk has applied for funding, for a new defibrillator in Tolpuddle by the Martyrs Museum, results expected within eight weeks.

**Car Park Maintenance:** Contractors are aiming to repair the Puddletown Play Park Car Park over the Christmas break. However, this is weather dependant and timings could change.

**Bus Shelter:** A contractor has been contacted for a quote to supply and install a new bus shelter in Tolpuddle. Due to the distance, they may need to subcontract the installation, so the quote may take time.

**Neighbourhood Plan Review:** The Council approved commissioning a consultant to conduct a basic review of the Puddletown Neighbourhood Plan at an approximate cost of £3,750. A working group including all councillors will be formed to assess project needs.

**Planning & Licensing Decisions:** The Council discussed and responded to two applications this month:

Woods Cottage, Puddletown – To fell a foxglove tree: Council Comment - No objection.

Manor Farm, Lower Waterston – To add solar panels to the recently approved agricultural barn for calves: Council Comment - No objection.

## Celebrating 200 years of the public railroads

Two hundred years ago, on 27<sup>th</sup> September 1825, the world's first public railway opened. It was the Stockton and Darlington Railway in north-east England.

Inspired and supported by a prominent Quaker, Edward Pease, and backed financially by many Quakers nationally, it has been described as "the great theatre of railway operations", sparking the explosion of railways across the world and boosting the industrial revolution. About 20 miles of the original 25 mile stretch still exist, now as part of the Northern Rail line.

The technical expertise behind it all came from George Stephenson, an extraordinary self-taught engineer whose expertise, which originated in the mines, stretched beyond railways. His *Locomotion No 1*, built for the Stockton and Darlington line, was the first steam locomotive to carry passengers on a public rail line. He worked with his 18-year-old son Robert, who is known for creating the more famous *Rocket* four years later.


The first Stockton and Darlington train – which in fact ran from Old Etherley Colliery, some distance north of Darlington – was led by a man on horseback with a flag. The motto of the organising committee was "At private risk for public service".

With brakemen stationed between the wagons, the train reached 12 to 15mph and was greeted by an estimated 10,000 people at the Darlington junction, where some passengers left and more boarded. The average speed was calculated at about 8mph. Six wagons of coal were given to the poor by way of celebration.

A nine-month festival in County Durham and the Tees Valley – with artwork, spectacles and community events – is marking the bicentenary of the opening of the railway.

As a tribute to his life and achievements, a bronze statue of George Stephenson was unveiled at Chesterfield railway station in 2005. An earlier statue stands in Neville Street, Newcastle.
