THE VICAR'S LETTER

Advent Hopes

Seeking inspiration for this letter, I asked some of my family what Advent meant to them. "Chocolate," said Ben (aged 9); "I don't know," said Amity (aged 7). Not a great start!

We did get on slightly better when I asked what the meaning of Christmas was for them. "Giving, and thinking about Jesus," was Amity's response; Ben followed with "Jesus's birthday".

In our day, the marketing managers seem to have a good sales tool for their products by packaging them

in cardboard behind 24 small doors and putting a premium price on them. Children may think Advent these days is about chocolate; adults are lured into believing it's about make-up, whisky, gin, luxury food items, scented candles, coffee, cheese, perfumes, if modern calendars are anything to go by. The most unusual one I've come across this year is the Inkvent calendar, selling at a mere £67(!), which provides a new bottle of fountain-pen ink for each day of December until Christmas Eve.

This has totally turned the original meaning of the Advent calendar on its head. In the past their purpose was to help us wait for and anticipate the arrival of God's gift of Jesus at Christmas time; now it seems they are about instant gratification.

This desire to have things and to have them now is part of modern society – and not I think a healthy one. It highlights the gaps between those who have and those who don't; it causes stress and unhappiness and a constant desire for more rather than a sense of gratitude for what we already have. Our lives become a whirlwind of activity and doing, and we become less able to stop and allow ourselves to savour the experience of just being.

The busier we are, the more important it can be to take that time to stop and rebalance our lives. Let me encourage you this Advent to make time each day to stop and be. Perhaps the opening of an Advent calendar door could be the prompt you need. Whether it be five minutes or 25 minutes, why not find a place where you can sit and just be? If you're a person of faith, use it to become aware of God alongside you, not requiring anything of you during that time than that you enjoy being in divine company.

If we use Advent well, we will find we reach Christmas in a more receptive frame of mind, less stressed and with more space to reflect on and welcome the Christchild into our hearts and lives. After all, the simplest celebrations are often the most enjoyable.



Puddletown's Centenarian has passed away

The "little old lady" who until recently walked to the village shop at least twice a day passed away at the wonderful age of 106.

Mrs. Nona Glasper was born in Darlington and was one of four sisters and five brothers. She worked in a large house and then went on to work for the railway painting signal boxes, bridges and tunnels and eventually working in a school as a kitchen assistant.

She married Arthur Glasper in 1949 and moved to Lincolnshire living in a shepherd's hut, where she had to cook everything on a two-ring hob and a wood burner (not like the modern ones) including cakes. They had one daughter who they also called Nona, and three grandchildren.

Later they moved to Salisbury, then to Northbrook in Puddletown, then to the Kennels where her husband was the Game Keeper and finally moving to Beech Road in 1980. Nona's husband died in 1982 and she has lived there for the rest of her life until she was admitted to hospital in Dorchester and peacefully passed away on the 2nd of November with her daughter by her side. She was only in hospital for a very short time.

Until very recently Nona enjoyed joining other residents in the Community Centre at Rod Hill, going out on trips with the group and very much enjoyed the monthly Lunch in the village hall.

Considering she was almost blind and deaf she enjoyed many, many years to

reach the age of 106.

God bless you Nona.



Looking After our Garden Birds

Winter can be a tough time for our garden birds. Natural foods such as insects, berries and seeds become scarce and they often start relying on what we put out for them to get through the winter, particularly if we get any severe weather.

In my house in Tolpuddle, I have mesh feeders full of sunflower hearts and peanuts, and as well as attracting the extremely numerous house sparrows, I also see finches, tits and robins and the occasional woodpecker! The small birds are




quite messy eaters, but any sunflower hearts that end up on the ground are happily tidied up by blackbirds, collared doves and dunnocks. I also make sure they always have water available for drinking and bathing, we have a garden pond but fresh clean water is also available in a bird bath on the flat garage roof!

If you've not fed the birds in the garden before and would like to start, the RSPB have excellent advice on their website (rspb.org.uk) on 'opening a bird café'! Here's some of their advice:

Place feeders high enough so they are out of reach of ground predators like cats. They should be a couple of metres away from thick cover like bushes, so that small birds can beat a hasty retreat from aerial predators such as sparrowhawks.



Clean your feeders and bird tables regularly.

Clear up under your feeders - you don't want a problem with rodents at night.

As well as buying nuts and seeds specially for the birds, you can feed them some of your Christmas leftovers!

Some of our own food can be good for birds – for example, fruit cake or mince pies, dried fruit (though be careful as they are poisonous to dogs), unsalted nuts, or apples and



pears past their best. Try sprinkling grated mild cheese under trees and bushes for more timid birds like wrens and dunnocks. But choose the right stuff...avoid anything mouldy or salty (too much salt is poisonous to small birds).

Enjoy! It's time to take a moment to watch and enjoy the happy birds feasting on the food you've provided!







And finally we thought we would share some drawings of 'our mum' – we really love them and hope you do.




