I've just come across a story from the 1920s about a rather wayward curate. He wrote a grumpy letter to the local paper, moaning about the positioning of house numbers in certain streets in Andover, where he lived. These houses had long front gardens, and his gripe was that the house numbers were not at

the garden gate at the entrance to the property, but attached to the front door where they couldn't be seen from the street. In his view this caused a needless and hazardous trek up 'circuitous' garden paths - only to discover once at the front door - that he was at the wrong house. It made evening visits especially difficult, so he declared he would no longer visit houses in these particular streets.

Now I do have some sympathy. Finding house numbers in the dark can still be frustrating; I have often walked or driven past the very house I was looking for, but even so it's a poor excuse for giving up visiting altogether..

I may not use such excuses to get out of my work, but I do have a good line in them when it comes to other areas of my life, most notably the domestic and horticultural!

On a more serious note, I wonder what opportunities and experiences we miss out on in life, because the excuses in our head outweigh the positive voices that say "Go for it".

Summer is often a season of change, especially for young people - leaving school or university, starting new jobs, travelling, or moving to new places. It reminds me of times in my own life when I let opportunities pass me by - not because I didn't want them, but because I lacked the confidence to step forward

Change is often uncomfortable. Stepping into something new can feel daunting. But life is always offering us the gift of new beginnings. What matters is whether we're willing to step past our excuses, listen to the voice of courage, and take that first step.

But life is always full of the gift of new opportunities.

Sometimes they come disguised as challenges or arrive at inconvenient moments. Often, they ask something of us — our time, our trust, our willingness to move beyond what feels safe. But if we always wait until we feel completely ready, we may never move at all.

The good news is that we don't have to have it all figured out. In moments of change or uncertainty, God walks with us — not pushing us from behind but gently leading us forward. Faith doesn't always remove our excuses, but it can give us the courage to look past them.





Month on the Farm



The rain at last arrived and with the warmer temperatures the grass growth is picking up again, albeit that some patches on the gravel had already gone brown and died. We have made some round bales of silage to build up the winter stocks but the yields are down on usual, which I put down to the cold nights and long dry period we have just been through. Hopefully by cutting some fields again we can get a good cut and make up for lower yields. Some of the grazing fields have been tidied up with the topper to take off the seed heads and get the grass and herbs growing with a new lease of life. All the fields that can have some fertilizer have had a light

coating of nitrogen and sulphur mix and will soon have their requirements of phosphate and potash to replace any of the nutrients that have been used up or removed in the cutting/grazing practices.

The last couple of weeks has seen our 6 monthly TB Test done over four days and in spite of some large lumps (reactions to the injections), the whole herd is clear. We were able to fly spray some of the cattle as they went through the race on one day but on the next it was wet, so we were only able to drench some of the younger cattle against worms which can be a problem in the first grazing season, but by the second the cattle's natural processes have cut in so they do not need a treatment until the end of the season.





The ewes and rams were all shorn on the last Sunday in May and fortunately we had shut them in the barn for the night as we had a shower of rain which would have messed up the plan, as although the sheep can be shorn the wool cannot be rolled up and packed in the wool sacks if it is wet. The two shearers and one roller made quick work of the job and were on their way again by mid morning and the flock were turned out to grass with the ewes looking much smaller without their fleeces.

The maize is growing very unevenly again due to the dry weather but should now all grow away well since the rain and the plant roots getting down well into the ground to pick up the nutrients from the muck and cover crop residue, we have been through with a weed killer to tidy up any unwanted plants that will compete with the maize. The winter barley and wheat are well and into ear with the barley just changing colour slightly as it grows through the ripening





Postal scams come in many forms: fake lotteries, bogus health cures, clairvoyant promises, and investment traps. They often use official-looking seals, urgent deadlines, and personal touches to manipulate recipients. The goal? To extract money through deception, often targeting older or isolated people.

What's most alarming is that only 5% of these crimes are reported. Victims often feel ashamed or unsure of where to turn. But the truth is, these fraudsters are professionals. Falling victim to their tactics is not a sign of weakness, it's a reflection of how sophisticated these scams have become.

By participating in SCAMnesty, you're not just clearing out your junk mail, you're contributing to a national effort to protect others. Every piece of scam mail sent in helps the National Trading Standards Scams Team build cases, shut down operations, and prevent future harm.

PUDDLETOWN AREA PARISH COUNCIL

As the warm days of summer unfold across our countryside, we're pleased to share the latest updates from the June Parish Council meeting held at Tolpuddle Village Hall. With decisions made on community safety, park improvements, building maintenance, and planning, we continue to make progress on the matters that keep our parish safe, vibrant, and welcoming for all. Here's a look at what's been happening in your local area.

Road Safety: The Council continues its work to improve road safety across the parish. Speeding has remained a concern, particularly in Puddletown, and with one of our Speed Indicator Devices (SID) currently broken, councillors agreed to purchase a replacement at a cost of £2,695 plus VAT. Alongside this, Cllr Hood will lead an initiative to revive the Community Speed Watch programme. If four volunteers can be found, the Clerk will organise training and help get the group up and running again. It's a valuable opportunity for residents to help tackle local speeding and make our roads safer for everyone.

Puddletown Recreation Ground and Play Park: At Puddletown Recreation Ground, a recent audit of the existing seating highlighted the need for a refresh. Councillors approved the purchase of two new picnic benches and two flat seats with backs, including the necessary ground anchor bolts, at a cost of £1,840 plus VAT. These additions will improve comfort and accessibility for all visitors to the play park and recreation area, offering families and residents more space to relax and enjoy the outdoors.

Work also continues to maintain and protect the PRIDE building, which serves as a vital community resource. Following damage to a shutter, councillors voted to approve repairs and a full servicing of the remaining shutters. Wessex Industrial Doors will carry out the works at a total cost of £2,758 plus VAT, ensuring that the building remains secure and fully functional.

Parish Safety: Playground safety and emergency equipment checks are carried out regularly by the Council. Weekly internal inspections of the Butt Close, Orchard Meadow, and Puddletown Rec play areas revealed no new concerns. Both defibrillators across the parish were also checked, with no issues to report. In Tolpuddle, we're excited to confirm that the Martyrs' Museum has granted permission for the installation of a defibrillator on their building. The Clerk will monitor the British Heart Foundation's grant funding programme and apply if it reopens shortly. If not, the Council will proceed to purchase the equipment at an estimated cost of £1,335 plus VAT, including cabinet and installation.

Youth Council: The Youth Council project continues to go from strength to strength. Councillors received a verbal update highlighting the strong turnout of young people and their passion for shaping the future of their community. It's heartening to see this level of engagement from the next generation, and we remain committed to supporting their initiatives and ideas. *Empowering tomorrow's voices, today*.



Notes from St Andrew's


Our Annual Parochial Church Meeting was held jointly with All Saints', Dewlish, at the end of May. A well-attended Eucharist at All Saints was followed by meetings to elect Churchwardens and other officers for the coming year and to receive reports on various aspects of church life during the past year.

After 11 years or so, Pam had decided to step back from her churchwarden role, although she will continue as a PCC member and as our Deanery Synod Rep. So, Tony was re-elected as Churchwarden for Milborne and Jim Burg and Sue Britton for All Saints. Pam was presented with a bouquet of flowers and gifts to mark her retirement and thanked for all she has done for St Andrew's (and will continue to do so, "in retirement"!)

Sarah was presented with flowers for all she does in the Benefice, particularly her work at St Andrew's and All Saints'. Emma received flowers for her work as Treasurer this past year. At the short business meeting following the APCM, Angela was appointed Secretary to the PCC, and Penny Pearce was appointed our Treasurer. We are grateful to Penny for volunteering her services. Her expertise in all things financial will be a great asset.

Our Milborne Praise at the beginning of June was held on June 1st, "Dorset Day", so we celebrated two local saints – St Aldhelm, and St Wite (or Candida). Aldhelm was a very talented man and was the first Bishop of the newly created See of Sherborne in 705 AD. St Wite was a 9th-century Saxon lady from west Dorset, whose Shrine is still a place of pilgrimage in the Church of St Wite and the Holy Cross at Whitchurch Canonicorum. She is said to have been murdered by marauding Danish Vikings invading Charmouth in 831 AD. Think of her the next time you go for a paddle or a fossil hunt.

Our Eucharist for Pentecost/Whitsunday was celebrated by the Reverend Heidi Merrett, assistant Priest in the Dorchester team Ministry, who also preached. Her address reminded us that the Holy Spirit is available to all. The Church looked splendid, decked in red, with many candles and the chandeliers lit. It was good to welcome visitors, who helped make up a larger-than-usual congregation. Thanks to Lin for ensuring there were splashes of Pentecostal red in the flower arrangements. At the end of the Service, Tony presented June with a bouquet to mark her birthday the preceding Friday – 21 again, June?? A particularly rousing rendition of "Happy Birthday to you" was followed by applause. Our good wishes go to Ernst Wagner, as he celebrated a "significant" birthday that weekend - Herzlichen Glückwunsch zum Geburtstag!, Ernst. In the evening, the Paschal Candle was moved from the Sanctuary, marking the end of the Easter Season. The Candle will be lit at Baptisms and Funerals, reminding us that the Risen Christ is present with us from birth to death and beyond.



95% of the Hassocks given in memory of the late John Corrigan and worked by members of John's family and many villagers, have succumbed to damp, mould and infestation. Each will now be photographed, and the dedications and names of those who worked the cross-stitch will be recorded and kept in the church archives. Unfortunately, the hassocks themselves will need to be disposed of. The two larger ones for the priests' and curate's Stalls are still in good condition and will be retained. Sheila Price and Margaret Daniels worked on them. Reading the names of those who had undertaken the cross-stitch was a trip down memory lane; many people associated with St Andrew's and are now "gone before".

As we look forward to the summer sunshine, I recall words from a favourite hymn, written by William Walsham How, author of "For All the Saints", and the first Bishop of Wakefield:

"Summer suns are glowing Over land and sea.... Light of light shine o'er us On our pilgrim way; Go, thou still before us To the endless day."
