

### God's own field

Harvest, in the agricultural sense, is well past. All is safely (or soggily) gathered in and the appealing blocks of barley and hay baling our landscape into a pop-up sculpture park have all but disappeared. The Church's Harvest celebrations – extended as a 'Creationtide' season into October – are in one sense, then, a delayed thanksgiving for the yield of former months. That needn't trouble us, however, for they are just as much focused on a rather less specific future point: the anticipated end of the world believers know as the Last Judgement. For many, this is merely one of the vestiges of a Christian worldview with little bearing on present times, a sickle blade blunted by unbelief.

Nevertheless, the idea of a harvest that separates the righteous from the unrighteous often crops up in Jesus' teaching and has gained a new edge as we witness the ecological ends of our actions, more fearfully evident with each passing, and slightly warmer, year. The once-familiar Parable of the Wheat and the Tares tells us that good and evil inevitably grow together in this life: one is easy to mistake for the other and this fact should caution us away from prejudice or self-righteousness. But it is also a warning that the real myth is the one that imagines our actions have no lasting or eternal consequences. They do, they will - and to ignore this is simply to hasten the day.

### **Friends of Puddletown Church**

The Friends held their Annual General Meeting in the Church on 13<sup>th</sup> July, 2023. We were glad to welcome several new members, especially since we had lost a few who had moved away from Puddletown or, sadly, had died. There will be one major change in the committee this coming year as Ursula Pomeroy is stepping down as Treasurer and Membership Secretary. Happily, Bob Todd has agreed to take on this role and has been co-opted as Treasurer. Otherwise the committee remains the same, with Colin Allder as Chair, Janet Nassim as Secretary and Jill Temple continuing with Communications and Membership.

Did you know that the fragments of coloured glass in the North windows may be medieval? This was assessed by an expert from Salisbury Cathedral, and a second assessment is due shortly. There is much work to do to all the windows but these two are the most important. The Friends are grant-aiding the initial assessment to kickstart the whole project.

Another grant agreed last year contributed to the electrification of the Church clock – meaning that Robin Mears, Tower Captain, no longer has to make the arduous weekly climb to wind the clock by hand. Robin very kindly sent the Friends a warm note of thanks. The clock keeps time to the minute! Last year too, a new "surround sound" system was installed, also working very well and leaving no "deaf" spots in the church. At this year's AGM members approved a grant to help defray the cost of this system. A third grant was made to cover the cost of the iron worker – a rare trade these days – who repaired an iron hinge on the North door, and the door has been re-hung.

If you have appreciated any of these improvements, please join us to ensure that St Mary's continues to serve Puddletown well. It has been at the centre of our village's life and heritage for 8 centuries. 

### Month on the Farm



Rain, wind and even temperatures more common in April have not helped with getting the harvest in, although the forecast is more hopeful for the days ahead. But still no hay has been made; but plenty of silage has been baled and wrapped and the one good thing about rain, it has made the grass continue to grow, certainly a different problem compared to last year's August.

The Harvest is progressing slowly, with the winter oil seed rape cut and sent off the farm for processing, the winter barley is in the grain store for the cattle's winter feed ration, most of the spring barley has been cut and we await the test results to see if the quality is acceptable for malting and we are slowly cutting the wheat when the weather is favourable

weather is favourable.

The other issue in a damp harvest is the straw which if baled soon behind the combine is fine, but where it has been rained on the straw will need turning until dry, otherwise it dries in the bales and sticks together and goes mouldy, not good as a feed or for bedding.


Getting the combine around this year has had its problems as it has been a tight squeeze a couple of times getting through Puddletown with cars on both sides of the road in the High Street. Each year before the start of harvest we have to apply to the Police for a license which



permits us to move the slightly wider harvesting vehicles to the fields and that



to the fields and that license we print off and have a copy of in each combine and every vehicle escorting them.





### Inn is open for business!

What joy it has been to have a pub open in Tolpuddle once more. The Martyrs Inn has re-opened after being closed in early 2020. The driving force behind this event has been Barrie Lovelock and a fantastically devoted team of helpers. The picture on the front of last month's magazine (August 2023) depicted the opening ceremony when Ray Kerslake and Ted Clayton cut a ribbon on the Saturday of what would have been the Martyrs Festival, which was sadly cancelled because of very rough weather. This has never happened before. Ray and Ted were chosen because each of them put in a huge amount of work in re -decorating and re-organising the building, although a great number of other people helped including Bev Clayton who is the Company Secretary.

Barrie paid particular tribute to the enormous amount of help given by the people of Tolpuddle who willingly volunteered to fill holes in walls, redecorate and generally re-furbish the pub which, frankly, had not had loving care and attention provided to it for some years. The number of people is too great to start mentioning names but we know who they are and I will try and put a little schedule of names together.

The Martyrs Inn is in several senses a community pub. It is actually a limited company and people were invited to buy shares at £500 a share. Some have bought one only but others bought more. It was over-subscribed and so we were able to run without a mortgage. There is a management committee of five and there will be an Annual General Meeting. The Pub is actually run by Mark and Leslene Fulton who have previously been involved in the hospitality industry in Dorset. Nobody would claim that there has not been the odd "teething" issue but these are being sorted out.

We would say therefore that initially the pub is "feeling its way", and so, for example, it is open from Wednesday lunch time to Sunday evening with interesting menus but it is envisaged that the menu will become more comprehensive. Mark has organised some very successful hog roasts already this summer. So, these are early days but it is such a great joy to go over and have a pint with friends and neighbours as well as to welcome other people to the village. I spoke to a young couple and their two children at the weekend. They

were from Holland and found the pub on the internet – we do need visitors to come in and spend their money and they are very welcome.

In fact, everyone is welcome to come in on this great initiative.



A significant number of people are struggling to afford their mortgage, while others are frightened of getting in arrears with their rent and being made homeless, some are finding difficulty affording car repairs to get to work, while others can no longer afford the weekly shop. There are so many different issues affecting people locally, but Dorchester Citizens Advice can provide expert advice on benefits that might be available, can negotiate with companies if you are in debt or refer to Dorchester Poverty Action to provide financial help. Come and find out more.

Dorchester Poverty Action through referrals from local professionals and charitable organisations are helping people in DT1 and DT2 with some of their financial problems. In the last financial year over £63,000 was distributed locally through grants and Co-op vouchers, a 47% increase in the number of grants distributed in the previous year.




