

### New Year's Hope



Doing the Reverse Advent Calendar (see December Vicar's Letter) led me to some reflections on the resolutions we make at New Year.

Normally these would entail trying to do something that will improve us – lose weight, give up smoking, spend more time with our partner, get fit, learn a new skill and so on. All great things to do, and I have benefited greatly from my decision last year to lose weight, as many of you know (three stone off and counting!) I really couldn't let the "zero birthday" pass by without wanting to look Fab at Fifty!

Why is it, though, that we are much less likely to make resolutions that enhance the lives of others? We know about the difficult lives some lead, but it is all too easy as we go about our day-to-day business to push them out of mind. Setting aside something each day of Advent for the Food Bank made it much harder to do this, because each day I was faced with making the decision about what I could give that would enhance the life of someone else, in this case a person with a particular need.

I'm writing this letter in early December as that's what publication dates require, so I haven't quite got past Christmas to the New Year in my mind. However, I have decided that this year my New Year's Resolution will be based not on doing something for me, but on expressing my care and concern for others in some way.

Generosity is one of the gifts God loves to see in the world. I hold dear the Bible verse which says "God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9.7). Generosity springs from love. God's generosity to us arises out of God's love for the world. We have so much, although often we are slow to acknowledge that.

One of the best ways of becoming increasingly generous is to become increasingly grateful. As we acknowledge the good things in our lives, our hearts focus on what we have rather than what is missing. That is why some of the poorest Christians in the world are also able to be the most joyful and generous. I'm humbled when I hear them speak of gratitude for so little, and their willingness to share what they have, meagre though it be, with others. It seems that somehow the more we have in material terms, the more we take for granted, and the less willing we are to share.

Jesus commended the poor widow for giving her two small coins to the Temple treasury (Mark 12.41-44). In his eyes, she had given far more to God than the wealthy people who gave a great deal more in material terms but which they'd never miss. It's the spirit with which the gift is given that counts not the value in pounds and pence.

#### **NOVEMBER TALK**



There was a good turnout for the November meeting; this was a talk about bats. We discovered there are 1,300 known species of bats in the world and new species are still being discovered to this day. One being the Dog Face Bat which was only discovered this year, along with one other bat.

Our most common bats are the Pipistrelle and Hognose Bat which are the size of 2 fingers and eat mainly insects and moths. Moths have learnt to make a click sound that can configure into the click sounds of a bat to confuse them.

There are 17 other species of bats in Britain. Sixteen of these species breed in Dorset except the Mouse Ear Bat which doesn't breed in this country. The Pipistrelle Bat is the breed that lives in the roofs of our houses.

The oldest bat recorded was 40 years old. Possibly older, as this was the time that had passed since he had been ringed. No one knows how old he might have been when he was first caught to be ringed. I use the word "He", but I don't know what its sex was.

Most bats in Britain live 6 to 10 years, and a baby bat is called a pup.

So, as you can tell from this potted example of this very interesting talk there was a lot we learnt about the bat.

#### Puddletown First School in November and December

Working with children always keeps us focussed on the future, the possibility of what could be, the hopes for the children. In school looking back is often tinged with regret with the nagging 'if only we had.....'rather than 'I'm glad that we....' Someone once said the masterpiece is never finished, the artist just ran out of time and so it is in schools.

Therefore, our act of Remembrance for Armistice day in November, marking the 100 years since the world began to return to peace after four years of

As ever though we began our Christmas run in with a special Reflection Day in which we focused on Advent and the incarnation of God's own son Jesus Christ. In amongst the glitter (environmentally friendly of course), Santa and parties it was important that all the children understood the Christian meaning of the season as we went on to celebrate His birth and tell His story in our wonderful Christmas Production that was enjoyed by so many.

Through it all we remembered that as we strive to be 'Shining Lights' in our school so we return to the words of St John, that Jesus '*was the true Light, which lighteth every man that cometh into the world*.' A true Christmas gift as we moved from our period of remembrance and one that we hold as we enter 2019.




We were also very lucky before Christmas to secure Chris Copson,



### The Beatles' last concert

It was 50 years ago this month, on  $30^{th}$  January 1969, that the Beatles gave their last public performance – on the roof of Apple Studios in London.

It was their first truly live show since their final tour ended on 29th August 1966, at Candlestick Park in San Francisco. They had become less popular in the US after John Lennon's controversial remark in an interview that 'we're more popular than Jesus now'.

In the rooftop concert, which lasted about 45 minutes, Get Back was the final song, and in the recorded version Lennon can be heard saying: 'I'd like to say thank you ... I hope we passed the audition.'

It was cold and windy, with a threat of rain. Lennon borrowed Yoko Ono's fur coat, and Ringo wore his wife Maureen's red raincoat. The group also varied their classic stage placements: Lennon took the middle spot, with Harrison to his left. Keyboard player Billy Preston guested.

The police are widely criticised for breaking up the session, but in fact they were nearby and could have shut it down after the first song; instead they let it continue and gave the band ten minutes' warning that they were about to intervene after complaints from neighbouring businesses.

The Beatles broke up formally in April 1970.

The Magi brought three gifts to Jesus: gold, frankincense and myrrh. Gold was a gift that would have been given to a king. Frankincense was brought by priests as they worshipped God in the Temple. Myrrh was a spice that the ancients used in preparing bodies for burial.

So you could say that the Wise Men, in choosing their gifts, honoured Jesus with gold because He was King of the Jews, with frankincense because He was to be worshipped as divine; and with myrrh, because He would also become a sacrifice and die for His people.

The Wise Men were the very first Gentiles ever to worship Jesus. What faith they had! They never saw any evidence of Jesus' kingship, His divinity or His sacrificial death. They simply worshipped Him through faith in God's promises alone.



## Latest news from Dorset Trading Standards

Counterfeit goods - What is the real threat?

When we think of counterfeit goods we probably think of films, music and clothes, but what about electrical goods, cosmetics, or toys? These all have to meet certain safety standards set down in law. These standards are there to protect the consumer.



Counterfeit goods may not meet these standards: 98% of a batch of apple electrical chargers tested failed to pass one or more of the safety tests; tests on counterfeit lipsticks have found 300 times the permitted amount of lead in them; In 2016 airbags for vehicles which turned out to be counterfeit were found; in 2017 one Trading Standards service seized 88,000 counterfeit toys in the run up to Christmas. All of these failed safety tests and all highlight the potential harm to the public from counterfeit goods.

If something on sale seems to be too good to be true then it probably is. Organised crime groups play a large role in the supply of counterfeit goods and they obtain significant financial benefit from doing this.

#### Top tips to help you avoid buying counterfeit goods

When buying online check the spelling and grammar on the website and of the URL – often the people behind these sites do not pay a lot of attention or care to this detail. Fraudsters may also try to deceive you by slightly changing the spelling of a well-known brand or shop in the website address.


Look to see where the trader is based and whether they provide a postal address – just because the web address has 'UK' do not assume the seller is based in the UK. If there is no address supplied or there is just a PO Box or email be wary.

Deal with reputable sellers - only use sites you know or that have been recommended to you. If you have not bought from the seller before then do your research and check online reviews.

Get the trader to tell you if they provide an after-sales service, warranty, or guarantee.
