

Finding God's Presence in Lent

As we enter the season of Lent, which begins with Ash Wednesday on 5th March, we are reminded that the month of March is a time of reflection, renewal, and growth. The days gradually lengthen, the earth begins to awaken, and we too are invited to look inward and ask how we can deepen our

relationship with God and with one another.

Lent is a season of preparation, a season when we can set aside distractions to listen more closely to God's voice in our lives. We might do that in all sorts of ways, and our churches are offering opportunities to come together with others to do just that. There are booklets in church with all the details in – as well as our usual Sunday services, we're offering short, midweek services; Lent lunches; and two courses: a daytime one in Milborne St Andrew based on the book *Wild Bright Hope* and an evening one in Puddletown centred on the classic film *Casablanca*. All these are open to everyone – you don't have to be a regular churchgoer to come and join us. We'd love to see you.

Groups and services can help us become more aware of God's presence, but Lent is a good time to stop and reflect on where God finds us in our daily activities and life.

Wild Bright Hope has some quotations from children about where they experience God, reminding us that there are no limits to God's presence. Here are some of them.

Italian 5-year-old: I see God when I look at the stars with my mummy. They are so pretty and make me feel like God is watching me.

Indian 7-year-old: I see God when I light a candle with my parents. The warm glow makes me feel God is close to me.

Kenyan 10-year-old: I experience God when I help my friends at school. Sharing with others makes me feel God's love inside me.

Japanese 11-yeard-old: I see God when I meditate in the garden, listening to the birds and the wind. It feels peaceful, like God is whispering to me through nature.

Nigerian 13-year-old: I see God when we gather as a family to pray every evening. Our prayers bring us closer to God and to each other.

Iranian 15-year-old: I feel God's presence when I'm dealing with confusion or making tough decisions. When I pray or talk to someone I trust about my worries, it reminds me that God is guiding me through the confusion.

German 16-year-old: I experience God when IO play music. The melodies and harmonies make me feel connected to something bigger than myself.

Nature, music, prayer, family, friends – there are so many different ways to experience God. I wonder how many you will find this Lent.



Month on the Farm



As the month of February speeds along the days are certainly getting longer but so far not much spring-like weather. In spite of the dull and damp days the cattle out grazing the turnips and cover crops are not treading or poaching the ground too much. The cold and small amount of snow before Christmas though did kill off the mustard crop and now there are no green leaves, just a hard dry stalk

for the cattle to chew on and tread into the

ground. Their consumption of silage bales which are put into round bale feeders has increased, but the cattle seem very content wandering the field looking forward to their fresh block and new bales every morning. The older group of cattle on the mixture of turnips and oil radish have still got plenty to eat and are not so keen on the bales!

The sheep are due to start lambing in early March and are still out on the

there is a sudden change.

permanent pasture. As they are getting closer to lambing they are being fed a protein nut and a molasses based 21% lick which is poured into 40 litre containers which have a wheel in them that the sheep lick round thus having some food as they turn it, a very sweet and sticky syrup which the sheep really go for and is meant to balance up any deficiency in energy requirements as the lambs grow inside their mothers. Any day now the ewes will be brought into the poly tunnel back here ready to settle in before lambing and will have their nuts increased in relation to the number of lambs they were scanned to be carrying and ad lib silage for the all important late pregnancy lamb growth stage and the making of lots of good quality colostrum and a plentiful milk supply when the lambs pop out.



We had hoped to have done that by now but it has been too wet for the machinery to travel without making ruts in the fields so we are waiting for a few dry days!! Over the past month we have been planting up some gaps in hedges with a mixture of species and tomorrow a group of hedge specialists are coming to start assessing all the hedges on the farm as part of our environmental scheme requirements.







The Costly Mistake Many Divorcees Make

Divorce is often an emotionally challenging experience, but many overlook a crucial legal step that could leave them financially vulnerable. Failing to secure a legally binding financial settlement can expose divorcees to unexpected claims, even years later.

Laura Martin, Partner and Head of Family Law at Blanchards Bailey, highlights the importance of addressing financial matters alongside the legal dissolution of marriage.

"A Final Order legally ends your marriage, but it does not automatically sever financial ties between former spouses," Laura explains. "Without a Financial Order, financial claims remain open even after the divorce has been finalised, allowing an ex-spouse to pursue assets acquired long after the divorce. It is only a Financial Order that can conclude financial claims."

A landmark case illustrates this risk. In *Wyatt v Vince*, a woman sought financial relief nearly two decades after her divorce when her former husband had made a fortune. The Supreme Court ruled that, as no Financial Order had been in place, her claim remained valid. This serves as a warning to those assuming their financial affairs are settled simply because their marriage is legally over.

Why a Financial Settlement Is Essential

A financial settlement during divorce ensures clear division of assets, preventing future disputes. Key considerations include:

- **Property & Investments:** Determining asset division, including the family home.
- **Pensions:** Crucial for long-term financial security.
- Savings & Debts: Avoiding future conflicts over financial responsibilities.

Spousal and Child Maintenance: Establishing ongoing financial support if needed.

Couples can secure a financial agreement through negotiation, mediation, or a court application.

The Legal Process: Securing a Consent Order

If both parties agree, they can apply for a Consent Order to ensure financial security and prevent future claims. If no agreement is reached, the court intervenes based on the *Matrimonial Causes Act 1973*, considering factors such as:

- Each party's income, financial resources and earning capacity.
- Future financial needs and obligations.

- The standard of living during the marriage.
- The duration of the marriage and the age of both parties.
- Any disabilities affecting financial stability.
- Contributions.
- Conduct, if significantly unfair to overlook.
- Lost benefits, such as pensions, due to the marriage ending.

Laura warns that failing to secure a Consent Order can lead to unexpected financial claims.

"Many assume there are no lingering financial ties post-divorce," she says. "But without a legally binding Financial Order, claims can still arise."

For those going through divorce, obtaining legal advice on financial settlements is essential to ensuring financial closure.

We are pleased to say that we are once again holding a series of **Lent Lunches**, the donations from which will go to WaterAid. The dates and venues are as follows:


- Thursday 13th March at Anne and Mike Fell's "Uptop", at 12.30pm
