The power of small things

For many people, August often brings a change of pace. No children to hustle out of the front door to school, perhaps some time away, fewer meetings and long, sunny evenings of relaxation. Many people take the opportunity to slow down a bit.

But not everyone has that luxury: farmers can't just abandon their animals or leave the crops unharvested, working parents still need to get the children out of the door to childminders or holiday clubs, employees in hospitality face one of their busiest times, and fortunately people who work in our essential services – medical, power, refuse collection and so on – carry on working, often even harder than usual because of colleagues who take a summer holiday. For some, August can be one of the busiest months of all. To all of you who keep things going while others pause: thank you.

This mixture of rest and activity, of stillness and service, reminds me of something deeply important: the value of small things. Often, it's the smallest gestures that stay with us. A friendly wave from a passing car. A neighbour who checks in. A kind word in the queue at the shop. These simple acts may not seem much in themselves, but they can quietly transform someone's day. And we can include them in our daily life regardless of how busy or not we are.

Three small examples from my recent experience show how easy it can be to make a powerful difference even with a small action.

I was with a group of young people who were given a choice between two activities. The sun-catcher option proved unexpectedly more popular than the other, but there weren't enough materials for everyone to participate. As the children eagerly rushed forward to grab their preferred craft, one thoughtful girl, who had managed to secure one, noticed the disappointment on another child's face. Although she had wanted that activity for herself, she generously gave it away. It was a lovely gesture. But the story didn't end there — the second child then offered to let the first join in with her, and they made the sun-catcher together. A small unselfish act led to partnership and friendship.

Not long ago I lost the white part from my Vicar's dog collar. I knew roughly where I'd been so I put a post with a photograph on the relevant village's Facebook page asking people to look out for it and to let me know if they found it, so I could go and collect it. A few hours later, two people turned up on my doorstep, collar in hand. I was so grateful.

There are lots of sweet peas around at present. These lovely flowers always remind me of my father, a particularly poignant memory since he died last year. I mentioned this to someone in passing; not long afterwards a small vase of that same flower was left on my doorstep but not I discovered by her; I don't know where it came from but it meant so much.



Month on the Farm

Last month I said the rain had at last arrived, unfortunately it did not amount to very much and as a consequence we are very short of grass with many of the fields completely burnt up. Some of the fields shut up for second cut silage have had to be grazed and some of the cattle are being fed the silage that we made in May, their winter feed!

The maize is extremely patchy with the earlier drilled growing well but the later sown after the turnip/cover crop mix is really suffering from the dry conditions, some plants having germinated and then dying off, the maize loves the



sun and heat which has made it shoot up where the roots have some moisture and is above shoulder height, while the later plants are not even up to my waist which though was great for small school children to run through on recent school visits.

The ewes and lambs are about to be weaned with the ewes going to graze some downland near Bramblecombe on the edge of Cheselbourne and the lambs staying here hopefully getting heavier but with the hot temperatures they are mainly lying around eating very little. With the large fly population everything will have a fly spray applied to help keep the flies off and so prevent any fly strike problems, the maggots hatching out and eating into the flesh of the sheep!

The cattle are growing well and everything outside is grazing along with either our barley mix or some silage. In a dry time the stock always look and do well as each mouthful of food whether it is dry grass or the corn is dry rather than mouthfuls of wet grass. We are still selling the bigger cattle but will be stopping soon as our 60 days after the TB Test movement permit will lapse.



Harvest has started with the winter barley all cut and in store with the straw baled and stacked in the barn. The yield for both the grain and straw was better than I had anticipated with everything being a nice bright yellow, rain would usually dull the colour. The price of grain has dropped still further which is usual at harvest time while the markets see what the yields

The fans have been running at night to cool the grain down as much as possible. Our next crop will be the Oil Seed Rape which will have to be cut at different times as the drilling dates were a month apart and the later drilled is about 2 weeks behind the earlier drilled fields.

We had some interesting conversations at the Health and Safety Event held here from overhead electric cables to the Air Ambulance and First Aid, we even had the Dorchester Fire Engine and crew discussing the ways to tackle any incident, an interesting and informative morning for the 70 farmers attending which was rounded off with a hot pasty.

We have just had another school visit this term, this time being Puddletown First School and the river stop was a real success catching lots of little fishes and numerous other freshwater creepy crawlies, hopefully Dorchester Girl Guides the following evening had a similar success.





Lord's Prayer tops Shakespeare, Dickens, Churchill and National Anthem in public recognition poll

People in the UK are more likely to identify correctly a short extract from the Lord's Prayer – also known as the Our Father – than one from the National Anthem and other sources chosen for their deep cultural resonance, a new poll has found.

The polling, carried out for the Church of England, also found the reference in the prayer to being forgiven and forgiving others was the element people found most meaningful to them.

Pollsters Savanta surveyed more than 2,000 people across the UK. They asked them to match seven famous lines - spanning areas ranging from literature and history to popular culture — with their source, from a list of correct answers.

Overall, the phrase from the Lord's Prayer was recognised correctly by the largest number of people (80.3 per cent), just ahead of Star Wars (79.9 per cent).

They were followed by Hamlet's "To be or not to be" (73 per cent) the extract from the National Anthem (63 per cent); the line from Churchill's 'The Few' speech (61 per cent); and You'll Never Walk Alone (58 per cent).

Overall, 89 per cent of those surveyed said that they had previously heard of the Lord's Prayer or the Our Father. This was highest among those who described themselves as Christian (95 per cent), but also by 88 per cent of those who said they had no religion.

The Archbishop of York, Stephen Cottrell, is currently leading a 'Lord's Prayer Tour' of events at churches and cathedrals across the north of England attended by thousands of people, as part of his *Faith In The North* initiative.

He said: "In a world of shifting cultures and changing circumstances, the Lord's Prayer remains a steady guide - perhaps never more so than now.

"Lines like 'Give us this day our daily bread' speak powerfully to today's challenges, reminding us to seek sufficiency, not excess, and to consider what 'enough' truly means."

Dogs and heatstroke

An over-hot dog is a serious matter – if they can't cool down, they are in trouble. So when is a dog too hot?

Vets warn that in temperatures of 20-23C, you need to be careful not to exert them. At 24-27C you are well into the danger zone, and over 27C is lifethreatening for them.

Dogs who suffer early on are those with short noses, flat faces, or heavy coats. Small dogs suffer worse than large ones, as do all older and overweight dogs.

Dogs cannot sweat through their coats, but only through the pads on their feet. They cool themselves by panting, which releases heat through the evaporation of their saliva from their extended tongues.

Here are the signs of heatstroke. If you see these in your dog, take action FAST, and call a vet: *Excessive panting, drooling, increased heart rate, very red or very pale gums and tongue, vomiting, diarrhoea, bloodshot eyes, increasing lethargy.*

Get your dog out of the sun and into the shade. Stand it in a tub of cool water, and splash its tummy, between its legs and under the tail – not just on the back. But cool it gradually - don't use very cold water, to avoid causing shock. Let your dog lie on wet towels.

As for Walkies, in hot weather, go before 8am and after 7pm. Hot pavements and roads can seriously burn a dog's pads. Try holding your palm on the pavement for 15 seconds - if it is too hot for you, it is too hot for your dog.

NEVER leave your dog in a parked car. A car left in the sun can heat up to 47C within an hour. And your dog enters the life-threatening zone at 27C.

Cllr Patterson brings valuable insight and is already active in the community. We're delighted to have him join the team.

Young Voices Making a Difference: A big thank you goes to the children of the Youth Council for submitting a detailed report highlighting issues along the Coombe Road footpath. The Parish Council has asked Dorset Council to: * Cut back overgrown vegetation. * Level uneven parts of the footpath (This includes the stepped area, the unmade mud ramp and several general areas along the path), * Install a salt bin and a new litter bin * Add safety railing near the school & Improve lighting / clear vegetation to allow more daylight in the winter months. Recently, the Gospel reading was the story of the Good Samaritan. Sarah began her address that day by saying it was difficult to think of

something new to say when the story is as well-known as that one. She then went on to preach an absolute tour-de-force of a sermon, jolting us out of our complacency and familiarity with the story. She certainly gave us plenty to think about!

On the 31^{st of} August, a fifth Sunday in the month, we hold the popular Farm Service at Parsonage Farm in Dewlish at 11:00 a.m. Harvest is now in full swing, and among the days of celebration during August, are Lammas Day (August 1st) the day when the "First Loaf" was offered, giving the alternative name to the day of Loaf Mass Day.. August 15th is the major Feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we pray for the Church community in Puddletown that day as the Church is dedicated in her honour. St. Bartholomew, about whom little is known, is celebrated on August 24th.



Watch out for counterfeit pet medicine

A cat named Smokey nearly lost his life after being treated with a counterfeit flea product bought online. The counterfeit product was a copy of a genuine and widely used 'Frontline' tick and flea treatment. The packaging itself looked legitimate but inside was a toxic insecticide that led to emergency surgery. Smokey survived, but his story is a warning to pet owners everywhere.

The Intellectual Property Office is warning that criminals are increasingly targeting pet owners through online marketplaces. In fact, over 18,000 illegal animal medicines and supplements were intercepted last year alone. A recent survey revealed that 60% of buyers were influenced by ease of access in buying online, and 72% wrongly believed the quality of counterfeit products would match the real thing.

Pet owners, beware: counterfeit pet medicines including flea treatments are being sold online and they could make your pet seriously ill. These products are untested, unregulated, and potentially lethal. One pet owner described a fake treatment that smelled like white spirit. Others have reported spelling errors and poor-quality packaging. Both reports can be clear red flags that something isn't right.

So, in general terms, how can you protect your pet?

Buy only from trusted sources - such as licensed vets, pharmacies, or reputable pet retailers.

Check the packaging - look for spelling mistakes, poor print quality, or unusual smells.

Be wary of large price discounts - if the price seems too good to be true, it probably is.

Report suspicious products - contact Trading Standards if you suspect a fake.
