Peace at Last

"Well, darling, the war in Europe is over at last. I remember I used to say that, when it was, I would get drunk. This is honest, sweetheart, I never touched a drop but I said a prayer and thanked God for his guidance and kindness. It's been a long time and a good part of my life wasted. Still I suppose it was all for the best."

The above is an extract from one of more than 200 letters written by Douglas Lowe to his sweetheart Marjorie Suggitt. It is dated 10 May 1945. Two days earlier VE Day had taken place – marking Victory in Europe at the end of World War II. It was celebrated as a public holiday, and came exactly a week after German radio announced the death in action of Adolf Hitler.

The announcement that the war had ended in Europe was broadcast to the British people by the BBC late on 7th May. It was decreed that there would be a national holiday the next day, and the stage was set for huge celebrations. Prime Minister Winston Churchill had been assured that there was enough beer in the capital, and commemorative items, including VE Day mugs, were quickly produced.

St Paul's Cathedral held ten consecutive services giving thanks for peace, each one attended by thousands of people, and churches throughout the country rang their bells. It was a day of jubilation, relief, and reflection. Streets filled with dancing and laughter, but also with tears for those who had not returned. For many, it was the beginning of rebuilding lives, families and communities.

Eighty years on, we still live in the shadow of that conflict, but we also live in the light of the peace that followed. This anniversary invites us all—whether people of faith or not—to pause and remember the courage and sacrifice of those who served, and to give thanks for the freedoms we enjoy today.

It's also a moment to reflect on our own calling, in whatever way we live our lives, to be people of peace. In a world that still knows war and suffering, each act of kindness, each step toward reconciliation, matters.

Churches were very much part of the celebrations in 1945. We will also be commemorating VE Day in two of our benefice churches this year and invite you to join us. On 4th May, the theme for our 9.30 Milborne Praise service, led by Tony Fox, will be the 80th anniversary of VE Day. Also on 8th May at 2,30 p.m. there will be a service of remembrance and thanksgiving in Puddletown church, led by Margaret Rickard. Both will contain hymns, readings and prayers.

And listen our for our bell-ringers later in the day too.,





Month on the Farm

The Spring barley has all been sown and is nicely up in drill, but is now really in need of some rain as the young plants have not got enough of a root structure to find the moisture. All the crops are growing well, the oil seed rape is now flowering (the bright yellow flowering crop). The barley and wheat moving through the growth stages but is being held back by the north winds, lack of rain and the hot days and frosty nights. The grass fields have had some fertilizer sprayed onto them as a mixture of water, urea and humic acid, something we have not tried before but we should get better grass growth, whilst using less fertilizer, we have invested in a piece of new equipment to spread this so hopefully we will get the anticipated result.

A lot of the cattle have now have been turned out to grass, the autumn born calves are grazing the paddocks on the herbal leys around here and have done one round and the older cattle are on the permanent pastures and with the dry weather we are starting to graze the meadows here along the Piddle with others out along the Frome. We decided to keep some of the yearlings indoors and are feeding some silage and our rolled barley mix to them ad lib as the barley is not worth a lot to sell (about £154/ton) to the mills and we can add value to the cattle by feeding them and getting them heavier quite cheaply with the intention of a good margin when they are sold later in the year. We have sold some more store cattle and the prices are very strong due to a drop in cattle numbers here in England and also World wide and the consumption of beef still a large part of people's diet.



The sheep have all finished lambing in what has been near perfect weather conditions for the young lambs and their mothers out grazing the grass and the youngsters racing around in their playgroups in the fields. The ewes are just eating grass with some molasses based lick to help keep their milk supply going for their growing lambs.

Sir Ernest Debenham and the village of Tolpuddle

A lot of people have remarked about the fact that the shelter on the green by the Martyrs Tree has been re-thatched by the National Trust and very good it looks too! The shelter was originally funded by Sir Ernest Debenham (who owned a farming estate in Briantspuddle, Affpuddle and Turnerspuddle) in 1934 as part of the celebrations to mark the hundredth anniversary celebration of the transportation of the "Tolpuddle Martyrs" to Australia for forming a trade union of agricultural workers in our village. As you know George & James Loveless, John & Thomas Standfield, James Brine and James Hammett were eventually pardoned and returned to the UK after protests and demonstrations in big cities.

In 1934 the cottages were also built and there was a huge demonstration of trade unionists from all over the country at the opening ceremony. Sir Ernest also did a good deal to help Tolpuddle using Arts and Crafts Movement designs to give James Hammett his own gravestone (he had an "unmarked" grave for fifty years), he bought land for the graveyard and also, as I have said, erected the shelter.

The annual rally and festival has been organised annually since 1947 by the National Union of Agricultural Workers and in recent years by the TUC (Trades Union Congress). It has been expanded in recent years and comprises music, historical analysis and discussion. The Rally & Festival will take place this year between Friday, 18th and Sunday, 20th of July and there will once again be a barbecue for village residents before the event.

So, do come out and celebrate on the day of the Rally and also come to the barbecue. The TUC is very pleased to see residents of the village and neighbouring villages at the Rally and Festival.

Disinheritance by Deception





If you think "fraudulent calumny" sounds like something from a Shakespeare play, you are not far wrong. The concept of pouring poison in the ear was a common theme for the playwright. Sadly, however, it is still very much relevant today in the context of Wills.

Lucy Mignot, Partner and Head of Contentious Trusts and Probate at Blanchards Bailey, explains this issue in detail.

Fraudulent calumny occurs when a person poisons a will-maker's mind against someone who would otherwise be their natural beneficiary, and as a result the will-maker disinherits the person they have been poisoned against or leaves them less than they would be expected to receive. If fraudulent calumny is proved, the entire Will may be rendered invalid and set aside, reverting to the Will-maker's previous will or, if they did not have one, the intestacy rules. In practice, these disputes are often between siblings, where one is alleged to have spread lies about the other to a parent. There are cases where it was alleged that a parent had been deceived into believing that one of their children had stolen from them. was a shopaholic and spendthrift, or was untrustworthy.

Fraudulent calumny will only be established if the person casting the aspersions knew that what they were telling the Will-maker was untrue or they did not care whether or not it was true, and there is no other explanation for the disinheritance. It is a subtle form of undue influence where, rather than being forced into making changes against their Will, the Will-maker makes the changes of their own volition because their perception of the person they are disinheriting has been skewed. Fraudulent calumny is often missed by inexperienced or non-specialist lawyers.

If you are concerned that a Will may have been affected by deliberate deception or you believe it may not be valid for any other reason, it is essential that you seek specialist legal advice from a contentious probate expert.



Friends also know where to report a scam and where to go to get help.

If you are part of a group and would like face to face training for a larger number of people, then please contact Trading Standards on the email below.

Examples include attending partnership events with Trading Standards staff, having face to face conversations with people in libraries, getting involved with informal coffee morning group discussions, and for some people who are confident in doing it, giving presentations.
