Looking back, living forward

A few days ago, I had a very lucky escape. I was driving past a local river when a flash of white caught my eye. For some reason I wondered whether it was a swan. A friend's son is very keen on swans, so in my mind was that I could tell him where I'd seen one, if that indeed was what it was. So I carried on driving but kept looking back at the river to see whether I could tell what sort of bird it was. So transfixed was I in trying to work out what the glimpse of white was

that I managed to pull out into the pathway of an oncoming car at a T-junction at the end of the road. I am very grateful that the driver of that car had quick reactions, and an accident was averted.

We all know that looking backwards while trying to drive a car or even ride a bicycle is likely to end in tears. If we are going to reach our destination safely, we need to keep our eyes focussed on where we are going and not on where we have come from.

In life more generally looking back does have some purpose – learning from past mistakes, for instance. But there are also times when we can get stuck in the past and find ourselves struggling to live fully in the present because we keep being dragged back by the thought of a poor decision we made, or something that has happened to us years back. We beat ourselves up or allow ourselves to be weighed down by feelings of guilt. There are people who get so caught up in things not being how they used to be that they find it hard to discern any meaning in their current life.

The prophet Isaiah from the Bible reminds his listeners at one point of God's message to them: "Do not remember the former things, neither consider the things of old. For behold, I am doing a new thing." (Isa 45.18-19) At the time God's people were in exile and finding it hard to settle because it's not where they wanted to be. They had a choice — to constantly hark back to the good old days or to try and make a future for themselves. God would be with them in that future. but no one could change what had happened in the past or turn the clock back.

That is a promise for us too: that the God who was with us in the past is the God alongside us now and who will not desert us in the future, whatever changes and new challenges we have to face.

Month on the Farm



At last the weather has started to warm up, the grass is now growing away from the cattle which means we can start to shut up some of the paddocks and fields so that they can bulk up ready to be cut for silage or hay for next winter's feed. The colder wetter days have caused a few worries for the cattle and sheep on the new leys (grass fields). The minerals have not travelled up through the roots and plant to the leaf which the livestock eat and we have had some magnesium deficiencies showing up. We have put some hay out for the sheep to pick through and the cattle have been on a barley concentrate mix which has cured the problem.

The lambs are growing fast on mother's milk and grass and we will soon start feeding some creep, a mix of barley and a specially milled sheep concentrate nut to help them put on some weight and condition. This is fed in a trough which allows the lambs to put their heads into but the holes are too small for the ewes except for the really determined ones!

The crops are racing on through the growth stages with the winter oilseed rape in full flower. The winter barley's awns are coming through and the early autumn sown wheats are at the flag leaf stage. The damp weather has made the disease pressure greater this year with the moisture helping to spread them around so keeping the agronomist on his toes and meaning that the spray application rates and sometimes chemicals have to be changed. The spring barley's have all come through well and are due a weed killer and fungicide mix. All the fertilizer has now been applied to the crops except for a couple of fields of later drilled wheats which are catching up fast with the others.

On quiet days we can carry on with the machinery maintenance and repairing the miles of fences either here on the home farm or on outlying rented ground.





Ten Minutes With... Shirley Parker

Let us go back in time to the 1960s. A significant decade in the history of Puddletown village because it was during this time that St. Mary's School in Coombe Road was built. Furthermore, long-time Puddletown resident, and the subject gracing our magazine cover this month, Shirley Parker, became employed there as Head of the English Department. No doubt some of you reading this were taught English or Religious Education by Miss Parker!

Shirley has recently celebrated her 90th birthday, and her family and friends held a party in the Church Room, to which many of our readers were invited.

We at the Parish Magazine, thought it would be interesting to find out more about Shirley's life, and are thrilled that she agreed to talk to us.

Born in Swansea, South Wales, from her early days, Shirley wanted to become a Teacher. The first step on that path was to attend Bristol University, and from there to St. Katherine's College in Tottenham, London. After qualifying, she gained a teaching post in Walthamstow and remained there for four years. After a move to live in Leicester, in the early 1960s, Shirley applied for a three-year tour with the British Army Schools in Libya, and successfully taught there until the situation with Gaddafi taking power in that country, caused her and her fellow colleagues to be suddenly flown back to the UK by the RAF. It was after that adventure that she began to search for her next post, and that brought her here to Puddletown in 1965!

Under the care of the first Headmaster, Mr. Birchenough, St. Mary's School was just beginning its life, and Shirley, having been successful in her application, was delighted at being able to establish a whole new English department and a Library from scratch. She thoroughly enjoyed her work over the next couple of decades as it also included visiting some of the smaller local schools. With reorganisation, in around 1980, St. Mary's became a Middle school and Shirley was transferred to the Girls Upper School in Dorchester.

During her working life in our County, home was firstly digs in Weymouth, followed by a flat in Dorchester's High West Street, before moving to a house in Puddletown's High Street. Now a fully-fledged member of this community, Shirley brought her parents, who were in Gloucestershire, down here to join her, and they created a home together in Shirley's present residence.

Although her long and happy teaching career drew to a close in 1988, any thoughts of retirement were cast aside as Shirley joined the Carers Associa-



tion and soon became the Chair of the Dorchester branch. This connection lasted for twenty-five years, and she found that her own experiences of caring for her parents as they had become older, invaluable to this role, and with her knowledge, was able to help others. She was nominated to join the West Dorset Community Health Council inspecting nursing and care homes and representing carers on both Social Services and NHS committees.

Her interest in and involvement with Ilsington House as a Guide, and a wish to preserve local history for the future, prompted Shirley to become a Founder member of the Puddletown Society, something with which she remains connected still. Many people will know that if a visitor to St. Mary's Church asks a question about its origins and its place in Puddletown, Shirley is one of the people to whom we look for the correct answer! She keeps her connections alive there too, as with many other village activities.

The high esteem in which many living in this Benefice area hold Shirley was shown by the number of birthday cards and gifts presented to her at her party, and she has a message with regard to this -

"I was completely overwhelmed by the generosity of people presenting cards, flowers and other beautiful gifts for my 90th birthday, and I apologise for not yet being able to thank everyone personally. Some of the labels became separated from the presents! Please accept these words as my gratitude and thanks to you all,"





Thank you from Dorchester Poverty Action

Dorchester Poverty Action (DPA) has been incredibly busy over the last year. The number of grants given out to those living in the DT1 and DT2 postcode areas has increased by 47% on the previous financial year. None of this would have been possible without the amazing support from local individuals, churches, business, trusts and community groups. Between April 2022 and March 2023 £63,000 was donated to the charity and £63,000 was distributed in a variety of ways across DT1 and DT2 to those experiencing financial problems.

Only 1% was spent on admin costs, which mainly was printing and insurance, as everyone at DPA is a volunteer. From the £63,000 donated, £16,500 was given out in Co-op vouchers by 11 referring agencies e.g. Social workers, health visitors, mental health teams, Care leavers support workers. Working closely with Citizens Advice, who are a key referring agency, other small grants were given out through them to individuals at crisis points. £3,000 was spent on school shoes and school uniform. School shoes are a major expense for a family especially at the beginning of the autumn term as children's feet grow so quickly. This year 208 grants were given to families and individuals compared to 141 last year. These included several washing machines, nursery equipment, furniture for a family escaping an abusive situation and a young care leaver, car repairs to get to work, flooring for a family with a toddler, a cooker, a double bed and mattress. Each of these items can place a huge strain on a household when the money coming in just does not meet the outgoings, however hard Citizens Advice try to help them make ends meet.

Thank you so much to all our donors.

DPA's next fundraising event is a coffee morning on Sat 1st July at the United Church Dorchester, South Street and then in September watch out for our Cream tea in a beautiful Puddletown garden.



We could not continue without them!


