Bumping into God

The title of this month's letter comes from a book by Dave Tomlinson (who was until he retired in July last year a Vicar in London). The book's title is unusual: *How to be a bad Christian . . . and a better human being*, but that shouldn't mislead you. Its content is actually mostly very wise and about expanding our experience of faith beyond the institutionalisation that happens all too easily in the Church of England and other denominations.

He writes: "We all have moments when we glimpse something beyond the purely material world, when we 'bump into God'. But we don't necessarily think of them as religious or spiritual experiences." He goes on to list the sort of things he means, the sacred moments that make us stop and reflect. These are things like receiving a smile from a child, gazing at the stars on a clear night, holding the hand of a loved one as they die, hearing a blackbird sing.

Some of these moments are joyful; some are hard. But all can be God moments. And sadly in our busy world, we so often miss the encounters with God because we don't make space for them. We don't linger long enough in contemplation or spend enough time being rather than doing.

These moments draw us to the greater reality beyond our human sphere that people of faith believe is God. Faith is a way of interpreting the world that helps us to make sense of those experiences of something other beyond us.

In the Church of England and many other Churches we use simple everyday things to remind us of God inside the church – bread and wine at holy communion, water at baptism. These sacraments are outward signs of God's inner work and grace among us.

But everyday things can speak of God outside the confines of a church service and ceremony too. God is all around us.

Tomlinson ends his chapter with these words, which for me sum up what bumping into God is all about. "Enjoy receiving Communion, but celebrate Christ's presence in every meal, every human interaction. 'Break open any loaf, taste any glass of wine, you'll find me there. Look not the eye of friend or stranger alike, you will see me looking back at you.'

Emmanuel – a title we hear used for Christ at Christmas – means God with us. It's not just one for the festive season.



Back in the summer, after an absence of over ten years, weekly bell ringing practice recommenced at Puddletown. Paul, Rod and I came along to learn under the instruction of Robin, Nigel, Jane and Paul. Firstly we were taken up the tower to see the bells and learn the different parts and understand how they worked. Over the weeks we were slowly taught how to ring a bell up and down, and eventually ring the handstroke and backstroke independently. A couple of months later we were joined by Mike and Poddy.

On November 11th we learners joined in with "proper" bell ringers in some rounds as part of the "Ringing Remembers" project. This was to honour the memory of 1,400 bell ringers who died in the First World War. We also received badges by becoming one of 1,400 new ringers across the nation, ringing on the centenary of the Armistice.

The GOOD news about chocolate



A little bit of chocolate is good for you - especially your heart.

If you eat up to three bars a month, you could have a 13 per cent lower risk of heart failure than if you do not eat any chocolate. It seems that natural compounds in cocoa called flavonoids boost blood vessel health and help reduce inflammation.

But be careful: if you eat chocolate daily you could experience a 17 per cent *increase* in your risk of heart failure. So the advice from the researchers at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai in New York is: 'moderate dark-chocolate consumption is good for health.'

Puddletown Area Parish Council

The Puddletown Area Parish Council, serving Puddletown, Tolpuddle, Athelhampton and Burleston, is currently 7 Puddletown councillors short, which leaves only 2 councillors representing the community. If anyone from Puddletown would like to fill one of those vacancies now then please contact the Clerk, Colin Hampton via email at puddletown@dorset-aptc.gov.uk or telephone 01258 837011. You can be co-opted to the council immediately as we are now less than 6 months away from the local elections. The whole council will be up for election in May with places available as follows: - Puddletown 9, Tolpuddle 3, Athelhampton 2 and Burleston 2. More details on how to put your name forward for election will be promulgated nearer the time and nomination papers will be available from me.

Information about the Parish Council can be found on the council's website http://www.puddletownareaparishcouncil.co.uk. It is recognised that this website is not particularly inviting to view, consequently a new website is currently being produced by a specialist firm which will be much more intuitive, easy to navigate and more informative. It is hoped that the new site will keep the same address but if not, a new one will be advertised as widely as possible.

At the December meeting of the council the budget for 2019-20 was agreed, which was set in order for there to be no increase in the precept on the current year of £44K. It was felt that with the uncertainty over the new Dorset Council's decision to introduce full council tax harmonisation in year one, which is certain to raise council tax by more than the previously capped levels, an increase in the parish precept should not add to the burden this year. At the January meeting it was confirmed that in addition to the Puddletown Recreation Ground and Tolpuddle's Orchard Meadow Playground, the council intends to develop the Butt Close play area and is currently seeking a grant to assist with this project.

Most of you will be aware that the Puddletown Neighbourhood Plan is currently on hold and the group members have sadly all resigned following a recent planning decision by the council which the group disagreed with. It is hoped that it will be possible to resurrect the plan and continue it to completion after the May elections.

"See you later, Benny"

It was with great sadness that we heard of Benny's death on Boxing Day, with Mel, Iona, Zac and Eleanor at his side in the Weldmar Hospice.

Benny's fifty-five years were action-packed and, as he said in his "blog", he always had a premonition that he would never see old age. Mel and their children had given great support since his diagnosis of cancer in August 2017 and Mel raised more than £6,000 for Cancer Research when she bravely had all her hair shaved off. We send them our love and deepest sympathy.

We would like to share the following written by Mel, Isaac, Iona and Eleanor on the back of the service sheet for the celebration of Benny's life, held at a very full St Peter's Church, Dorchester, on Tuesday 15th January, conducted by the Revd Sarah Godfrey:

Thank you for joining us today as we celebrate the life of our Benny. We know that his death will have left a hole in the hearts of many, but hope that the memories we share of his fierce thirst for justice and gentle, big hearted, compassionate love for everyone will be able to heal the pain we feel today...

Remember to smile, because we're not saying goodbye, only "See you later, Benny."

Benny was appointed Vicar of the Benefice in 2005 and with Mel, Zac and Iona left their London parish and came to live with us in Puddletown, with Sarah Godfrey as his Curate. Mel was still recovering from her horrific accident from two years earlier and the children settled into the local school. We were privileged to have them here for the next five-and-a-half years. During this time Benny started "Chill Zone" for the children after school and a social "get together" for the men involving fishing trips, whisky tasting and other activities. A very busy time with our four churches.

We were glad that the family stayed nearby when they moved to their new home at Cheselbourne in February 2011, as Benny became Mel's carer and took on part-time work as Prison Chaplain and more recently, as the Diocesan Vocations Co-ordinator.

Anyone who had the privilege of being in the congregation at the service at St Peter's will have been reminded of the inclusivity of Benny's ministry and the amazing impact he made on all those he met. God bless you Benny, and thanks for all the wonderful memories.

We hope to print the obituary for Benny in the next magazine, which will be in the *Church Times* shortly. You may also like to read Benny's final "blog" written just after he retired officially on 30 November. Within this he refers to a quote from the film Blade Runner.

QWERTY celebrates a big birthday

The inventor of the QWERTY keyboard – now almost universally adopted in English-speaking countries – was born 200 years ago, on 14th February 1819, in Pennsylvania. Christopher Latham Scholes was an Episcopalian who could trace his ancestry back to two of the original Mayflower pilgrims, John and Priscilla Alden.



Although he did not invent the typewriter from scratch, Scholes was instrumental in developing a successful working model. Vital to this was his changing the keyboard, which was originally in alphabetical order but had a tendency to jam. Scholes rearranged the levers so that frequently used keys would not interfere with each other.

Scholes started out as a printer and then, after moving to Wisconsin, became a newspaper publisher. He served two terms as a Senator for Wisconsin, one as a Democrat and one as a Republican.

His typewriter was not a commercial success until he joined forces with the Remington company, selling them half his rights for \$12,000. In 1878 he added a shift key so that the writer could switch easily between capitals and lower-case letters. He died in 1890, probably of tuberculosis.

We hold a Christingle service every year to which all children, their families and others from Milborne and other villages are welcomed; watch out for the announcements next December and come along and join in the celebrations!

Messy Church in Milborne

January's Messy Church was hosted by St Andrew's church in Milborne's Village Hall. Amazingly there were 19 children accompanied by one or both of their parents (and some grandparents) who came to make, listen and learn. The theme was 'belonging' and was based around the Bible story when Jesus was about 12 and, with his parents, went to Jerusalem for the Passover. However, unbeknown to his parents he did not start his journey home with them and was not found for 3 days. Jesus was eventually found in the temple, absorbed in religious discussion with Jewish teachers.

The session started with children and families doing activities which related to the theme. They were able to make a model temple; make cards which showed Jesus as a baby and as a 12-year-old; mark on a map the area that was special for them and to say a prayer; create a family shield; make a web to illustrate relationships; make a scroll similar to those used in the temple and finally get to taste foods that Jesus would have had to celebrate the Passover.

After the crafting Sarah explored with the children the difference between a baby and a 12-year-old child. She told the story of Jesus being 'lost' by his parents and made us all think about how terrified they must have felt but how he had found the place that he could stay with his 'Father'. We all sang a song to end this session.

Those who were able to stay enjoyed a hot meal cooked and supplied by volunteers. Many thanks go to all who helped make this session another successful Messy Church.

The next one will be on the 3rd of February in St Mary's Church Room, Puddletown starting at 4 pm. All are welcome to come along.





"It feels like fingernails!" Models of teeth and touching a baleen plate.


