Making the most of our moments

Every morning I receive a short email with a thought for the day from an organisation called Grateful living. Today's thought, as I write, is this: "The only way we can make the most of our lives is to make the most of our moments." It struck me that this is a very good thought for the beginning of a new year.

It is so easy to get tied up in plans for the future or anxieties about it that we forget to live each moment as if it were precious and valuable.

For some, time flies all too fast; for others, often alone and lonely or suffering in some way, it seems to drag. For those who are too busy, sometimes the need is just to stop and savour the moment, to be grateful for all we have. For those for whom time passes slowly, just take it one step at a time, one moment at a time. Find something enjoyable to do with that moment: be thankful, read a book, watch television, listen to the radio, ring a friend, do some knitting, go outside and so on.

Living in the present moment can make us more contented as we learn to be grateful for what we have.

We can't get back a moment once it's passed. For those who pray there is an additional awareness of God's presence when we learn to live more in the moment. Brother Lawrence wrote a book in the 17th-cenutry *The Practice of the Presence of God* in which there is much wisdom about using time well. Lawrence suffered greatly after a war injury and ended up in a monastic setting in the kitchen, a task we he did not naturally adjust to. So he found a way of making every moment of his life about God. He started his work acknowledging God's presence, he continued his work in conversation with God and he ended his work aware of God with him. "That his prayer was nothing else but a sense of the presence of God, his soul being at that time insensible to everything but Divine love: and that when the appointed times of prayer were past, he found no difference, because he still continued with God, praising and blessing Him with all his might, so that he passed his life in continual joy." Even though he suffered, Lawrence was able to appreciate each moment of his life.

When we find our moments either flying too fast or dragging too slowly, a sense that God is with us in them can really help us to value them more deeply.

What better resolution could there be than to appreciate every moment we have as a gift?

Month on the Farm



At the beginning of December we had our six-monthly tuberculous test (TB Testing) of all the cattle on the farm that are over forty two days old and I am pleased to say that there were no big bovine lumps which means the herd is clear of TB. While we were putting the cattle through the crush it is the ideal time to replace any missing ear tags that have been lost; they often get caught in the hedge and are pulled out. Each animal has to have two ear tags, obviously with the same number on in each ear - this is a legal requirement along with the paper passport with all the animal details, dam's number, date of birth, sex and then every movement to different premises has to be recorded.

We had left a lot of the cattle outside for the test but since that, and due to all the rain, we are bringing the younger cattle into the barns and the older ones we are moving off the grass to graze the turnips/mustard mix on the dryer fields. They will all have some of the round bale silage to eat and the younger ones will have some of the barley rape meal mix for some extra protein to help them grow a bigger framed body - the mix of feed needs to have the right balance or the cattle will be very fat but not very heavy.

We managed to get some more winter wheat seed drilled into some grassland which had been too wet and slippery until we had some frost which meant the tractor could grip on the hard surface. Some of the earlier drilled fields have had a pass with the sprayer to apply some herbicide to the weeds which are easier to take out when they are small. We will have to go through the oil seed rape with a fungicide for the disease but before we apply the herbicide it needs to be colder for the active ingredients to work. It is a fine balance with the crops being not too lush, the temperature being right and the rain staying away!

I can only say how much we are looking forward to all the church services which will be held over Christmas and in the last few weeks of this year.



This has only been possible now with the understanding and support of Wessex Multi-Academy Trust, school staff and governors, and my fellow trustees, but above all the drive and determination of the school Head, Mrs Cheeseman. With Liz Dyer retiring our move does indeed represent the end of an era.

Liz Dyer has been the driving force behind Ladybirds since its inception more than twenty years ago. Since co-founding the playgroup she has been prominent in creating a pre-school consistently rated good by Ofsted: our village, and past and present trustees have much to thank her for. We are fortunate that Liz has been prepared to delay her retirement in order to see-in our move to the First School.

Staff are delighted to be free of the daily grind of set-up and pack-away at the Village Hall although, having been there for some 20 plus years, it does feel a little like leaving home. We thank Village Hall committees present and past for their support over the years and hope their ideas for finding new revenues are realized.

Ladybirds has funded from reserves the alterations we needed to make to the school – mainly the new tiny toilets and wash basins. We will also need to continue to invest in updating equipment and facilities to support development in the school setting.

We hope our move to our own space within the school, continuing under independent governance, will attract more children to attend Ladybirds Pre-School. Both Ladybirds' trustees and school governors believe our co-location will significantly enhance the provision of early-years education for the village and surrounding areas.




